Not many people know this....


Where are they now?

Looking for something 'different' to write about, while still being relevant to what this programme is all about, is not an easy task week on week, but this one was an exception to the rule.

On this day 22nd October 2005, we travelled north to the GER Ground, home of March Town United, for a Ridgeons League Division One encounter. It was the season we were promoted back to the Premier Division and basically the start of our journey to where we are today. And guess what? We have a connection here today from that game which we won 4-2, with goals from Dwayne Edwards, James Buckle (now joint manager at Ipswich Wanderers) and prolific scorer Danny Phillips, who netted twice.

That connection ... Andy Crump, our first team assistant manager and coach, who played in that game and set up one of Danny Phillips' goals.





When I first started checking Andy's record, I found he actually made his club debut in 2000 for the reserves as a 15year old and played alongside Stuart Stevenson, our current first team fitness coach and sometime first aid man. Andy also made his first team debut that season at the ripe old age of 15 years 8 months & 19 days, coming on as an extra time sub at Chapel Road, Tiptree, in a League Cup encounter which we lost 1–0 after extra time.

I'm sure Andy wouldn't throw names about, so I will!! That season, our first team squad included John Wark, who some may have heard of... he played for Ipswich Town, Liverpool, and Scotland a few times, I understand. Another former Ipswich Town player on the books that season was Kevin Steggles, now one of our Academy coaches.

22ND OCTOBER 2005

While Andy was involved with the Seasiders at March Town United, our manager Stuart Boardley was 46 miles east of March at Fakenham, playing for Long Melford in a 4-2 win, it was Boards last game for the Villagers as the following week he signed for Leiston. Stuart had been released by Torquay in the May of 2005 following their relegation from League One having made 14 appearances for the Gulls - following his short spell with the Villagers he went on to make over 300 appearances for Leiston. Also on his resume is a small fact of scoring for Long Melford in a 5-2 defeat at the Goldstar earlier that season.



THE OTHER SIDE I-IASI-ITAG UNITED FC

Hashtag United Football Club was founded in 2016 by YouTube creator Spencer Owen, initially set up as a group of friends playing a charity match to honour a childhood friend. Over the next two years, Hashtag played friendlies and exhibition matches in an innovative league format devised by Spencer. The team had points targets set for a group of games, and if the targets were achieved, the team would be rewarded by The Chairman and would progress to the next level. The team played in this format across 7 countries against pro football staff teams, fellow YouTube creators, sponsor/ brand teams, non-league and Sunday sides.





The squad was bolstered by the addition of YouTube creators Theo Baker and Charlie Morley, and then graduates of the Hashtag Academy talent series which had run on Spencer's channel. Several thousand applicants were whittled down over a series of football challenges which eventually saw 16-year-old Scott Pollock emerge victorious. After impressing for Hashtag, Scott joined Northampton Town, making his senior debut in the 2018/19 season.

During this initial chapter the club also participated in the Next Level 7-a-side YouTube league and were invited to play in front of thousands of fans in the annual Wembley Cup alongside some of their footballing heroes.

In 2018 the club applied for entry into the FA's National League System, looking to make the considerable transition from exhibition team to a competitive club in the 10th tier of English football. They were granted a place in the Eastern Senior League Division 1 (South) for the 2018/19 season and appointed experienced non-league manager Jay Devereux to lead the transition, with home games being played at Haringey Borough's stadium. Despite a tough start, thanks to two long winning runs the team ended the season as champions, ensuring promotion at the first time of asking. The squad for the club's Essex Senior League campaign was further bolstered by the addition of more experienced non-league players and several from the second Academy series including winner Joshua Osude. At the point at which the 2019/20 season was voided, the club sat second with games in hand over the league leaders, and in two cup semi-finals.

The 2020/21 season was curtailed, but not before the club had a chance to make a dramatic debut in the Emirates FA Cup. A narrow victory over Park View in the Extra Preliminary round was followed by an extraordinary game against Felixstowe & Walton United, which ended in the second-longest penalty shoot out in FA Cup history, The Tags winning 13–12. The following round again saw the team pitched against





higher opposition, with the BBC Sport cameras in attendance for the tie against Soham Town Rangers. Another penalty shootout victory followed, setting up a huge challenge against Braintree Town in the Second Qualifying Round. Despite Hashtag taking the lead in the dying minutes, Braintree equalised immediately and then went on to win the shootout, The Tags' penalty luck finally running out.

At the time the league season was suspended, Hashtag sat top of the Essex Senior League, and in May 2021 the FA awarded the club promotion to the Isthmian League Division One North by virtue of their PPG record in 2019–21.

The club's debut season in the Isthmian League North saw them finish a creditable 8th, with the women's team winning the Essex Senior Cup and finishing runners-up in the FA Women's National League Division 1 South East.

Hashtag are also a successful esports (competitive gaming) team, with professional FIFA players competing at the world's top tournaments.

Matthew Wooldridge - RB



Lewis Watson - CM



BLACK HISTORY MONTH: ANDREW WATSON

In 2004, when Nigel Quashie ran out at the Lillekula Stadium in Talinn, Estonia, he was something of a rarity. Having switched his allegiance from England earlier in the year, he was making his international debut, and represented something that nobody at home or in the stadium had seen in their lifetime; a black footballer turning out for Scotland. But Quashie wasn't the first black player to represent Scotland. That honour went to Andrew Watson, but his story began almost 150 years earlier.

Andrew Watson was born in Glasgow in 1856 to a wealthy sugar planter and a local British Guianese woman. Little is known of his early childhood, but he was sent to school in Halifax, and at the age of just 13 lost his father. With his sizeable inheritance, he moved on to King's College School in Wimbledon, where his love of sports was fostered. Football, unsurprisingly, was his passion, and something he continued when he moved back to Scotland to attend the University of Glasgow.

While at university, he started his playing career at local side Maxwell, where he excelled as a full-back playing on either flank. He moved on to Parkgrove in 1874, where he also took up the position of match secretary, becoming the first black administrator in football. He stayed at Parkgrove for six years and continued to impress, eventually drawing the attention of one of Britain's, and the world's, biggest clubs: Queens Park.

The Glasgow giants (as they were then) were the dominant force in football, having



provided the entirety of the Scotland side in 1872, and developed the combination (passing) game that revolutionised the game that was mostly played with straight line running, a hangover from its evolution from rugby. He led the side to two Scottish Cups, becoming the first black player to win a major trophy, and *The Scottish Football Annual* of 1880–81 described Watson as 'one of the very best backs we have' recommending that he would be very worthy of a call up to an international side.

That call up wouldn't be long in coming, and Watson made his first appearance for the Scotland representative side in March 1881, captaining the side to a humiliating 6-1 win over the auld enemy, still a record defeat for England and a chastening lesson in the way football would develop over the following century and a half. He made his second appearance a few days later, in another dominant victory, this time over Wales. A year later he made his third appearance, again a 5-1 victory, against England again, before moving back to London. As the Scottish FA only picked players based in Scotland, this ended his international career.

One of the "Scotch Professors", a group of Scottish players who moved south of the border as English football professionalised, he joined Slough side Swifts and became the first black player to play in the English FA Cup, helping the side to an 8-1 over holders Blackburn Rovers, as well as turning out for Clapton based Pilgrims, Brentwood, and London Caledonian, a side in the capital for Scottish players. Along with the other Professors, he introduced the passing game to England, despite the level of abuse and vitriol aimed at him. He moved back to Oueen's Park in the middle of the decade but sadly was injured at the next opportunity for international representation. In 1887, he made one final move, to Bootle. Historian Tony Onslow described the move as 'the biggest coup in Merseyside' and, as Bootle paid him, Watson became the first professional player in England, predating Arthur Wharton by almost a decade. He retired five years later,



and lived out his days in London.

Upon the opening of the Scottish Football Museum in 2001, the founder Ged O'Brien commemorated Watson as 'the most influential black footballer of all time. There is nobody who comes close.' The first black Scotland player, the first black football administrator, the first black player to win a major trophy, and the first black player to be paid to play. It's safe to say, Arthur Watson is deserving of that praise.
