Wroxham come to us sitting 11th in the table having had an inconsistent start to the season, highlighting with a recent 6-1 victory over Stowmarket.

I'm sure they will arrive here and give a good show, as they always do. Over the years we have encountered many battles with our Norfolk rivals, having gone toe to toe many times in what was then the Jewson/ Ridgeon's, and now the Thurlow Nunn league.

I recall playing my one and only game in goal for Felixstowe over at Wroxham on a Tuesday night fixture. We arrived at Trafford Park for the then manager Paul Adams to explain that our keeper had failed to show up and he wanted a volunteer to go between the sticks. It all went quiet, only for the keeper's jersey to end up being thrown in my direction – a willing volunteer, not!

If my memory serves me correctly, we went on to lose 2-1 and cat like I wasn't... never again was I asked to perform these duties.

Back to current times and two very different games of football witnessed in the last few days, with three teams from the top four going head-to-head.

Last Tuesday's encounter at home to Brightlingsea didn't fail to live up to expectations. I said to the management on Saturday that if you ever wanted a match to highlight the quality of football often seen in our league then this was it. A wonderful game for the neutrals, with us finishing the winning side taking a 5-3 victory. A match very much in the "Keegan Newcastle style", as 'you score three & we will score more'. A night that saw a healthy crowd along with a great game, finishing with us taking home the all-important three points.

On to Saturday and could we carry on against a very stubborn Walthamstow unit? On a poor pitch at a typical non-league London ground, we failed from the beginning to reach the levels of our previous match. However, what we lacked in fluidity we didn't lack in effort and work rate, and the boys didn't give up fighting until the very end with a deserved equaliser coming in the 90th minute. A good point away from home without doubt!

A mention to summer signing Josh Mayhew, notching a hattrick against Brightlingsea, goals against Hertford, Lakenheath and two at Billericay, along with the last gasp equaliser on Saturday. Those who know local football will be fully aware of Josh's scoring record and after an inconsistent start to his Felixstowe career due to injury and unavailability, he is starting to show the scoring prowess we all know he possesses.

At the same time, it takes more than one man to make a team and it has shown this season... as a collective, the three lads up top, in Josh, Sam and Browny causing a problem for all the defences they have come up against. Pace, height, skill & power - all the attributes any manager would want from a front three, giving most defences serious problems.

Let's hope we can celebrate a further three points towards our promotion push by 5pm this evening and look forward to our Tuesday night fixture here at the AGL Arena when we welcome newly promoted Redbridge to town.


Oddly, in all the years we have made the trip, Wroxham have never had a midweek home game - we all like football, but I am the only one who has visited Trafford Park.

awarded a penalty but it was missed shortly after. The visitors were quick on the break and smacked the crossbar before taking a lead with an excellent finish just before the break from Ogunrinde. Felixstowe were guilty of missing chances throughout the second half but finally got the equaliser on 81 minutes, **Mayhew** with his second of the game. Seven minutes later and it looked like the home side had the winner, **Leon Ottley-Gooch** firing in an unstoppable shot just inside the box. There was plenty more action still to come! With 11 mins added on. The visitors fought back to level things up again on 93 mins through Embalo. PITCHING

PARTNERS WITH ISTHMIAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE













Wroxham FC were established in 1892 by GE Preston, a former captain of the Norfolk County team, and initially played on Wroxham Park. The club played friendly matches until joining the East Norfolk League and the Norwich City Junior League. In 1935 they joined the East Anglian League, before dropping down to the Norwich and District League in the 1950s, a time during which they suffered a record 24-0 defeat.

In 1963 the club became founder members of the Anglian Combination. A successful spell during the mid-1970s saw the club rise through the divisions. In 1975 the club won its first major trophy, the Norfolk Junior Cup. The following season they won Division Two, and the season after, Division One. In 1981 the club won the Knock-Out Cup, and in 1981-82 they won the Premier Division, retaining the title in 1982-83, 1983-84 and 1984-85, also winning the knock-out cup in 1983 and 1985. They did another league and cup double in 1986-87

In 1988 the club joined the newly formed Division One of the Eastern Counties League. They won the division in their first season, beating Halstead Town to the title on goal difference. After finishing twelfth in their first season in the Premier Division, the club have never finished lower than eighth. They won the title with a record 99 points in 1991-92, before beating their own record with 100 points and another title the following season, the club's centenary, in which they also won the League Cup and the Norfolk Senior Cup. In 1993-94 they won a third consecutive title. After a gap of two seasons, the club won the Premier Division again with 109 points in 1996-97, also winning the Senior Cup again. They retained the title and the Senior Cup in 1997-98, before winning the League for a third time in a row in 1998-99.

Wroxham won the Norfolk Senior Cup again in 2000, 2002, 2004, the Premier Division in 2006-07, and the Senior Cup again in 2008. In 2009-10 the club reached the final of the FA Vase but lost 6-1 to holders Whitley Bay. In 2015, in a thrilling Norfolk Senior Cup Final, they beat local rivals Dereham Town 3-2 after extra time.

Since the club was formed, Wroxham F.C. have played at several venues. The first was just off Norwich Road and subsequent grounds were at The Avenue and Keys Hill. The Avenue ground has now reverted to agricultural use, whilst the others have been built upon.

Around the time of World War II, Wroxham moved to their current ground, Trafford Park, a field close to the railway line in Skinners Lane. The club took with them an old timber pavilion that was erected and used as a primitive clubhouse. Fifteen years later this was replaced by prefabricated buildings, which were themselves flattened to make way for a new permanent clubhouse that was opened in 1994.

The current main stand, the Les King Stand, was built in 1990, replacing an earlier structure that had stood on the same site for around 10 years. The capacity at Trafford Park is 2,000 but the record attendance to date is 1,262 for the FA Vase semi-final against Whitehawk in 2010.

Wroxham finally took the opportunity to take promotion to Step 4 joining the Isthmian Division 1 North in season 2012/13 and played for 5 seasons with mixed fortunes.

After a disappointing 2016-17 season, The Yachtsmen returned to Step 5 with a new management team of Ross Potter & Tom Parke. After a promising start the team were soon out of the prestigious FA Cup failing for the first time in 22 years to get past the first hurdle. Form dipped around mid-season as the more experienced partnership of Jamie Godbold & Andy Reynolds were brought in. While we reached the semi-final of the League Cup, eventually losing to Brantham Athletic, League form remained erratic and we finished 13th in the table. This was the lowest finish we have ever had in the Eastern Counties Premier Division.

Goldbold & Reynolds shocked the club by announcing they would be leaving to join their old club Lowestoft Town. The Board acted quickly by appointing Reserve Manager Jordan Southgate assisted then by ex-Norwich City Hall of Fame player Adam Drury, to take charge. They put together a youthful squad an finished a credible 7th in 2018/19.

Behind the scenes the then Club Chairman Lee Robson did an amazing job developing a Wroxham Juniors section with teams at most age group from U7 to U18. With a strong Academy and U18's we hope to develop players who want to play the Wroxham way for the future. Wroxham saw Women's football for the first time at the Club with an Eastern Region Premier Division team (formerly Acle United) gracing Trafford Park.

2019/20 saw the Yachtsmen finish the truncated campaign in fifth place (although the League subsequently declared all results

void) having hovered around the runner-up spot for much of the season, conceding only 18 goals in 25 matches – a total bettered only by table-topping Stowmarket Town.

However, the Club's major successes of the season came in the FA Vase with a run to the quarter final. Two home attendances of around 1000, against Stowmarket Town in the 5th Round and Bitton AFC in the quarter final, generated much local interest and raised the profile of the Club regionally. Prior to the cessation of all football the Yachtsmen were defeated by Dereham Town in the semi-final of the Norfolk Senior Cup.

The 2020/21 campaign was also curtailed by COVID despite us leading the table with 10 straight wins.

We were not promoted to the Isthmian League until the 2022-23 season, after finishing 2nd to Gorleston we went up as one of the top 10 Step 5 clubs on a Points Per Game analysis by The FA.

After a rocky start to the 2022-23 season, the team soon adjusted to the demands of Isthmian League football and finished in a mid-table position. After consolidating our position in Isthmian League North, we hope to press on during this season.





Ollie Sutton – Club captain and a GK with a big personality on and off the pitch, a superb athlete having played his football at higher levels.

Travis Dodsworth – A young Left back who has elevated from the Reserve team when just 16, now, a few years later Travis has looked comfortable, calm and an established part of the squad.

Harley Black - Midfielder who has made more than 200 apps for the club, Harley has a great range of passing and has scored a number of goals from excellent free kicks. Forms a strong midfield partnership with Jordan King. A former NCFC Scholar and an integral member of the squad.

Shaun Taylor – Midfielder who epitomizes what the football club is about, the former Reserve Captain and Player of the Season who has progressed to a be a vital part of the first team, over 200 combined club appearances, Shaun is an energetic player who scores goals as an attacking midfielder.

Rio Abodunde – a young player who made outstanding progress last season. Graduated from the Under 18s through the reserves and into the first team for the latter games of the campaign. Has featured as right back/righr midfield during close season.

Ryan Miles – 2021-22 TNL Golden Boot Winner. Ryan was the Yachtsmen's leading goalscorer again last season in spite of missing a proportion of the season through injury, He was voted Supporters Player of the Year last season.

Jack Robinson - versatile player, Jack was brought in from Fakenham. Looking to establish

a regular first team place, and step up to performing at Step 4.

Jordan King – Midfielder. A regular alongside Harley Black in centre midfield. Takes pressure off the defence. Neat tidy competitive who can set the tempo for the team and leads by example.

Tom Huckerby – A centre back strong in the air but assured on the ground. Missed a large part of the 2022-23 season with a knee injury. Now returning to his pre-injury best.

Harry Barker – A youthful fullback who still brings a lot of experience, a former FA Youth cup winner with Norwich City, Harry has played in every league from Step 2 – Step 5, a great addition to the squad.

Robbie Linford - Former Dereham and Stowmarket defender / midfielder, Robbie brings a great understanding of the game, wears his heart on his sleeve and will raise the standards of every player in the squad. Players' player of the Year last season.

Josh Hazell – Josh is a modern-day CB who has brilliant talent on the ball, his range of passing is something to be admired. Someone the management team were keen to sign for a number of seasons. Manager's player of the season for 22-23.

Ryan Hawkins – Hawks doesn't need an introduction in the non-league game, a player with proven stats across a number of leagues from Step 1 – step 4, including back-to-back promotions with Kings Lynn to the national league. A hard working striker.

Josh Harvey – joined the club in close season from Lowestoft Town. A striker with

an eye for goal as he has shown in our pre-season fixtures.

Angus Mackie - a left sided defender who rejoined the club from Gorleston during close season. Sponsored by Andy Mackie Joao Angel- a skillful winger, and a creator of chances, equally at home in the centre of the pitch. Joao joined the club during the close season.

Haydn Davis – a recent signing. A left sided midfield player, Haydn joined the club from near neighbours Norwich United.

Grant Holt – A player who needs no introduction. Norwich City's Footballer of the year on three occasions. A player equally at home in attack or defence. Offers invaluable experience.

Jeorgie Batch – a young player who operates in midfield, he has been used as a substitute in a number of games already this season.

Jordan Southgate – Manager. Over 200 games managed for the club including guiding the us to promotion back to step 4. Jordan originally elevated through the system as reserve team manager. A former player of the club before early retirement loomed. UEFA qualified coach with maturity beyond his years as one of the youngest managers around at Step 4.

Matt Halliday – Assistant Manager – joined the club this season as Jordan's assistant Former player at the club, who played in the same defence as Jordan Southgate.

Darren (Daz) Plowman-Read - GK coach. One of the most highly qualified GK coaches in the county, Daz returns to the club after spells in higher Leagues and at the Norwich Academy. A great man with a passion to progress and improve goalkeepers. The perfect coach to steer Ollie in the right direction, as well as bringing through the youngsters!

Becky Squire – Phsyio- A fantastic physio and a great part of the dressing room, Becky has brought professional standards and shows passion to ensure the players are at peak condition.



THE MYSTERIOUS MANAGER WHO DISAPPEARED

When Charles O'Hagan turned up in Seville, it was quite a coup for the most successful club in Andalucia. Or so they thought. Here was a man who had played for an impressive Huddersfield side, as well as being part of an early Everton team that was making its mark in Liverpool. On top of that, he had won the FA Cup with Tottenham the season before joining Sevilla, so he brought a wealth of experience. Except, none of that was true. Charles O'Hagan did have a spell at Spurs, where he was impressive but never won the FA Cup. And he had signed for Everton, although he had never played a game. He was never on the books at Huddersfield. Like so much of the Irishman's career, how these stories came about was a mystery.

Charles O'Hagan can best be described as peripatetic. He began his career in his native Ireland, turning out for St Columb's College and then Derry Athletic, before moving to Liverpool in 1903. When he signed for Everton, he was working at a Spanish grocers, and supplemented his income in the Toffees reserves. He only lasted a year though, before his taste for adventure got the better of him and he moved to London, signing for Tottenham. Here he first made his mark on English football. Spurs were at that time outside the Football League, but his form was impressive enough to be called up to the Ireland national side, along with his Tottenham teammate Jack Kirwan, with whom he formed a formidable strike partnership. He earned the first of his 11 caps in March 1905, and scored the following month against Wales. Settled and scoring, it seemed he had made his home in North London. But he seemed to be unable to make a home anywhere. In 1906, he made the surprising move to the north east, and signed with Middlesbrough.

That move would fail to yield results, and

he lasted just a matter of months before he was on the move again, even further north, this time to Aberdeen. Scotland would prove to be his most settled home, spending four years at Pittodrie, the longest spell of his career at any club, and the longest spell in which he stayed in one city. He once again found his form and started scoring goals, earning himself a recall to the Ireland national side, and forming a great bond with winger Willie Lennie. As his career came to a close, he had short stints at Greenock Morton at Third Lanark, before finally calling time on his playing days. Only 31 and having not suffered any significant injuries, it seemed a short career. But as with everything O'Hagan did, he forged his own way.


Here, the Irishman disappears from the record, until the First World War when he was registered as Second Lieutenant of the Leinster Regiment, and then the Highland Light Infantry. He survived the conflict and disappeared again, before accusing his Aberdeen teammates of accepting bribes to throw a Scottish Cup game in 1915 and quickly withdrawing the claims. In 1920, he was given his first managerial role, at Norwich. The club was in turmoil, and he lasted only until January 1921 before resigning, having won just four out of 21 games. He once again disappeared, for over two years, before Sevilla made their dubious announcement.

In Spain, he became the first true 'manager' of Sevilla, the second oldest club in the country, and took charge of by far the most successful club in Andalucia. With the national league system still nearly a decade away, regional bragging rights were the goal, and Sevilla won 17 of 20 Andalucian titles. O'Hagan continued this proud heritage, winning the cup in 1924, his first season, before once again moving on. Sevilla fans suggested that his love of wine was incompatible with running a football club.

This time, the Irishman headed home. He settled in the Irish seaside town of Portrush, briefly, before accepting a generous offer to go and manage in Berlin. This would prove to be fatal to his football career, however. O'Hagan's version was that he arrived in Germany and was quickly outcast for having fought for the British Army in the First World War. Within weeks he was asked to leave, making much of the journey under his own steam and returning to Ireland penniless.

His little sojourn to Berlin would prove to be his last in football, as far as anyone can tell. In 1928, he set sail from Derry to New York, to begin a new life in the United States. There are some unconfirmed rumours that he became a journalist, though nothing has turned up with his name on it. One final time, he disappeared from the record.

THE NONLEAGUE PAPER ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

IS the 'new' season already two months in? The FA Cup first round draw has been made, the Isuzu FA Trophy and FA Vase are through a few rounds and the weather is taking a turn.

It feels like another Non-League season is flying by. Here are a few things that have caught our eye over the last week

CUP KINGS

The FA Cup fourth round qualifying served up some big shocks last Saturday, with eight National League teams tumbling out and more facing midweek replays.

Bracknell Town started the day off with a 1-0 lunchtime win over Dagenham & Redbridge. The Step 3 Robins took on Ipswich Town last season in front of the live TV cameras. For the first round this year they're off to League One Cambridge United.



Horsham also face League One opposition following their 2-0 upset of Dorking Wanderers – the Isthmian Premier side have been drawn against Barnsley.

Step 4 Cray Valley PM have got a great draw away at Charlton Athletic. Kyrell Lisbie scored twice in their 5-2 win over Enfield Town last week — he's the son of former Addicks striker Kevin, who also played for the Millers when they reached the FA Vase final at Wembley in 2019.

Other interesting first round ties include Chesterfield at home to Portsmouth — former club of Spireites boss Paul Cook — while Bromley host Blackpool. Step 4 Ramsgate host the winners of Woking's replay with Hemel Hempstead Town.

END OF AN ERA

It seems keeping a manager's job for five years is a long time these days. How about more than 25? That's how long Dave Diaper has been at the helm of Sholing. In that time he's overseen their rise — both on and off the pitch — from the Hampshire League to Step 3 via an FA Vase win at Wembley.

This weekend is his last game, however, as he takes on a new head of football role at the south-coast club with former Sutton United boss Paul Doswell set to take over in the dug-out.

"It's a great fit," Diaper said. "We're on the same page moving forward and it's quite exciting. We've got some big plans for the club. This year is about consolidation more than anything, but it's about working together and seeing what we can bring to the club in the future."

OLDHAM TWIST FOR MELLON

When Oldham Athletic announced they were parting ways with manager David Unsworth, you can be sure a lot of managers quickly brushed up their CV. The chance to manage the Latics is a huge draw for many.

We so often talk about the importance of National League experience when it comes to steadying a recently relegated EFL club after they have crash landed in Non-League.

When someone like Micky Mellon is available it becomes a much easier decision.

The former Shrewsbury and Northampton boss has won promotion into the Football League twice — first as a champion with Fleetwood Town in 2012.

He later returned to Non-League with the task of taking Tranmere Rovers back into the EFL — which he duly did in 2018 through the play-offs. That feat was immediately followed by promotion to League One. Mellon knows the division inside out and understands what it takes to be in the mix. He also had a certain James Norwood leading his Tranmere attack — their reunion at Oldham will excite fans too.

TEALE-Y GOOD SHOW

We also caught up with former Aston Villa defender Shaun Teale for last week's NLP. The rugged centre-half has recently published a book about his career titled: Here, There and Everywhere.

In 2003 he lifted the FA Trophy with Burscough by beating Tamworth 2-1 with the final, fittingly, at his old stomping ground Villa Park.
