
Oddly, in all the years we have made the trip, Wroxham have never had a midweek home game - we all like football, but I am the only one who has visited Trafford Park.

PITCHING

PARTNERS WITH ISTHMIAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE













Wroxham FC were established in 1892 by GE Preston, a former captain of the Norfolk County team, and initially played on Wroxham Park. The club played friendly matches until joining the East Norfolk League and the Norwich City Junior League. In 1935 they joined the East Anglian League, before dropping down to the Norwich and District League in the 1950s, a time during which they suffered a record 24-0 defeat.

In 1963 the club became founder members of the Anglian Combination. A successful spell during the mid-1970s saw the club rise through the divisions. In 1975 the club won its first major trophy, the Norfolk Junior Cup. The following season they won Division Two, and the season after, Division One. In 1981 the club won the Knock-Out Cup, and in 1981-82 they won the Premier Division, retaining the title in 1982-83, 1983-84 and 1984-85, also winning the knock-out cup in 1983 and 1985. They did another league and cup double in 1986-87

In 1988 the club joined the newly formed Division One of the Eastern Counties League. They won the division in their first season, beating Halstead Town to the title on goal difference. After finishing twelfth in their first season in the Premier Division, the club have never finished lower than eighth. They won the title with a record 99 points in 1991-92, before beating their own record with 100 points and another title the following season, the club's centenary, in which they also won the League Cup and the Norfolk Senior Cup. In 1993-94 they won a third consecutive title. After a gap of two seasons, the club won the Premier Division again with 109 points in 1996-97, also winning the Senior Cup again. They retained the title and the Senior Cup in 1997-98, before winning the League for a third time in a row in 1998-99.

Wroxham won the Norfolk Senior Cup again in 2000, 2002, 2004, the Premier Division in 2006-07, and the Senior Cup again in 2008. In 2009-10 the club reached the final of the FA Vase but lost 6-1 to holders Whitley Bay. In 2015, in a thrilling Norfolk Senior Cup Final, they beat local rivals Dereham Town 3-2 after extra time.

Since the club was formed, Wroxham F.C. have played at several venues. The first was just off Norwich Road and subsequent grounds were at The Avenue and Keys Hill. The Avenue ground has now reverted to agricultural use, whilst the others have been built upon.

Around the time of World War II, Wroxham moved to their current ground, Trafford Park, a field close to the railway line in Skinners Lane. The club took with them an old timber pavilion that was erected and used as a primitive clubhouse. Fifteen years later this was replaced by prefabricated buildings, which were themselves flattened to make way for a new permanent clubhouse that was opened in 1994.

The current main stand, the Les King Stand, was built in 1990, replacing an earlier structure that had stood on the same site for around 10 years. The capacity at Trafford Park is 2,000 but the record attendance to date is 1,262 for the FA Vase semi-final against Whitehawk in 2010.

Wroxham finally took the opportunity to take promotion to Step 4 joining the Isthmian Division 1 North in season 2012/13 and played for 5 seasons with mixed fortunes.

After a disappointing 2016-17 season, The Yachtsmen returned to Step 5 with a new management team of Ross Potter & Tom Parke. After a promising start the team were soon out of the prestigious FA Cup failing for the first time in 22 years to get past the first hurdle. Form dipped around mid-season as the more experienced partnership of Jamie Godbold & Andy Reynolds were brought in. While we reached the semi-final of the League Cup, eventually losing to Brantham Athletic, League form remained erratic and we finished 13th in the table. This was the lowest finish we have ever had in the Eastern Counties Premier Division.

Goldbold & Reynolds shocked the club by announcing they would be leaving to join their old club Lowestoft Town. The Board acted quickly by appointing Reserve Manager Jordan Southgate assisted then by ex-Norwich City Hall of Fame player Adam Drury, to take charge. They put together a youthful squad an finished a credible 7th in 2018/19.

Behind the scenes the then Club Chairman Lee Robson did an amazing job developing a Wroxham Juniors section with teams at most age group from U7 to U18. With a strong Academy and U18's we hope to develop players who want to play the Wroxham way for the future. Wroxham saw Women's football for the first time at the Club with an Eastern Region Premier Division team (formerly Acle United) gracing Trafford Park.

2019/20 saw the Yachtsmen finish the truncated campaign in fifth place (although the League subsequently declared all results

void) having hovered around the runner-up spot for much of the season, conceding only 18 goals in 25 matches – a total bettered only by table-topping Stowmarket Town.

However, the Club's major successes of the season came in the FA Vase with a run to the quarter final. Two home attendances of around 1000, against Stowmarket Town in the 5th Round and Bitton AFC in the quarter final, generated much local interest and raised the profile of the Club regionally. Prior to the cessation of all football the Yachtsmen were defeated by Dereham Town in the semi-final of the Norfolk Senior Cup.

The 2020/21 campaign was also curtailed by COVID despite us leading the table with 10 straight wins.

We were not promoted to the Isthmian League until the 2022-23 season, after finishing 2nd to Gorleston we went up as one of the top 10 Step 5 clubs on a Points Per Game analysis by The FA.

After a rocky start to the 2022-23 season, the team soon adjusted to the demands of Isthmian League football and finished in a mid-table position. After consolidating our position in Isthmian League North, we hope to press on during this season.





Ollie Sutton – Club captain and a GK with a big personality on and off the pitch, a superb athlete having played his football at higher levels.

Travis Dodsworth – A young Left back who has elevated from the Reserve team when just 16, now, a few years later Travis has looked comfortable, calm and an established part of the squad.

Harley Black - Midfielder who has made more than 200 apps for the club, Harley has a great range of passing and has scored a number of goals from excellent free kicks. Forms a strong midfield partnership with Jordan King. A former NCFC Scholar and an integral member of the squad.

Shaun Taylor – Midfielder who epitomizes what the football club is about, the former Reserve Captain and Player of the Season who has progressed to a be a vital part of the first team, over 200 combined club appearances, Shaun is an energetic player who scores goals as an attacking midfielder.

Rio Abodunde – a young player who made outstanding progress last season. Graduated from the Under 18s through the reserves and into the first team for the latter games of the campaign. Has featured as right back/righr midfield during close season.

Ryan Miles – 2021-22 TNL Golden Boot Winner. Ryan was the Yachtsmen's leading goalscorer again last season in spite of missing a proportion of the season through injury, He was voted Supporters Player of the Year last season.

Jack Robinson - versatile player, Jack was brought in from Fakenham. Looking to establish

a regular first team place, and step up to performing at Step 4.

Jordan King – Midfielder. A regular alongside Harley Black in centre midfield. Takes pressure off the defence. Neat tidy competitive who can set the tempo for the team and leads by example.

Tom Huckerby – A centre back strong in the air but assured on the ground. Missed a large part of the 2022-23 season with a knee injury. Now returning to his pre-injury best.

Harry Barker – A youthful fullback who still brings a lot of experience, a former FA Youth cup winner with Norwich City, Harry has played in every league from Step 2 – Step 5, a great addition to the squad.

Robbie Linford - Former Dereham and Stowmarket defender / midfielder, Robbie brings a great understanding of the game, wears his heart on his sleeve and will raise the standards of every player in the squad. Players' player of the Year last season.

Josh Hazell – Josh is a modern-day CB who has brilliant talent on the ball, his range of passing is something to be admired. Someone the management team were keen to sign for a number of seasons. Manager's player of the season for 22-23.

Ryan Hawkins – Hawks doesn't need an introduction in the non-league game, a player with proven stats across a number of leagues from Step 1 – step 4, including back-to-back promotions with Kings Lynn to the national league. A hard working striker.

Josh Harvey – joined the club in close season from Lowestoft Town. A striker with

an eye for goal as he has shown in our pre-season fixtures.

Angus Mackie - a left sided defender who rejoined the club from Gorleston during close season.

Joao Angel - a skillful winger, and a creator of chances, equally at home in the centre of the pitch. Joao joined the club during the close season.

Haydn Davis – a recent signing. A left sided midfield player, Haydn joined the club from near neighbours Norwich United.

Grant Holt – A player who needs no introduction. Norwich City's Footballer of the year on three occasions. A player equally at home in attack or defence. Offers invaluable experience.

Jeorgie Batch – a young player who operates in midfield, he has been used as a substitute in a number of games already this season Sponsored by Premier Education

Jordan Forbes – young player signed at start of the season but just returned from a three month loan spell at Sheringham FC. Now very much part of the match day squad at the Yachtsmen. Harvey Peters – a recent signing. A centre back who arrives at Trafford Park having recently played for Watford FC Under 18s.

Jordan Southgate – Manager. Over 200 games managed for the club including guiding the us to promotion back to step 4. Jordan originally elevated through the system as reserve team manager. A former player of the club before early retirement loomed. UEFA qualified coach with maturity beyond his years as one of the youngest managers around at Step 4.

Matt Halliday – Assistant Manager – joined the club this season as Jordan's assistant Former player at the club, who played in the same defence as Jordan Southgate.

Darren (Daz) Plowman-Read - GK coach. One of the most highly qualified GK coaches in the county, Daz returns to the club after spells in higher Leagues and at the Norwich Academy. A great man with a passion to progress and improve goalkeepers. The perfect coach to steer Ollie in the right direction, as well as bringing through the youngsters!

Becky Squire – A fantastic physio and a great part of the dressing room, Becky has brought professional standards and shows passion to ensure the players are at peak condition.

PITCHING

Lowestoft Town made it five wins in a row and nine from their last ten, with victory at Wroxham. It was a victory which saw the Trawler Boys have to wait for an hour to score, and then saw them play for around half an hour with ten men, but it was another three points nonetheless, and left them a point clear at the top. Harvey Sayer was the Town hero, opening the scoring on the hour and adding a second fifteen minutes later, whilst Robert Eagle picked up that red card. Notably, the match saw the end of Jake Reed's scoring streak, the Lowestoft striker having scored in his previous nine matches but with sixteen goals already we're sure it won't be long before he gets another.

Felixstowe and Walton United kept up the pressure on Lowestoft with a hard-fought victory at Heybridge Swifts. The hosts were twice ahead before the Seasiders took control. First, Rob Harvey opened the scoring after twelve minutes, and, four minutes after Charlie Warren had levelled for the visitors, Jack Adlington-Pile made it two-one to the hosts shortly after the restart. Just after the

hour a penalty was awarded to the visitors, and Callum Harrison converted it - and the same player got the winner twelve minutes from time. By then Swifts had gone down to ten men, Tyler Brampton departing with twenty minutes to go. Felixstowe remain unbeaten, and that's four wins in a row.

Maldon & Tiptree have been in fine form of late, and a fourth win in a row – and a sixth from seven – saw them up to third. The Jammers didn't have the best of starts at **Bowers & Pitsea**, Ben Williamson delighting the Len Salmon faithful after just five minutes, but the Jammers turned the match on its head in the least twenty one minutes. First, George Smith levelled, and then a minute later Terrell Egbri put them ahead. With four minutes left on the clock Harry Phillips added a third, but a penalty from Williamson gave Bowers hope with only two minutes left. That hope remained unfulfilled.

Basildon United are fourth, after a draw at **Grays Athletic** on Friday night. Kyle Jude gave the Bees the lead on seventeen minutes, but Athletic earned a point, Charlie Stimson equalising just after the break. Athletic are still looking for their first win.

Walthamstow won at **Redbridge** by the odd goal in five. That's a closer margin than expected after Stow went two up in the first half - George Ironton and Adalberto Pinto- and then added a third on the hour, Ollie Sotoyinbo on his latest debut. In the last two minutes the Motormen finally made a fight of it, Oscar Shelvey-Negus getting a goal back, Lewis Clark adding another - but there was no time for an equaliser. Stow are fifth.

Brightlingsea Regent slip out of the top five after defeat by an impressive New Salamis side at Coles Park. The hosts saw Thomas Avgoustidis give them the lead on twelve minutes, and they doubled it six minutes later, Albert Add with his first of the campaign. Former home hero Derek Asamoah moved to Regent only recently, so he most certainly new the way to the dressing room when he picked up a red card just after the half hour, and his former side quickly took advantage, Ibrahim Kemidide making it three. Twelve minutes after the break a fourth arrived, Avgoustidis with his second of the afternoon, although the ten men made the scoreline more respectable in the last fifteen minutes, Bradley Russell and Charles Brown-Bampoe bringing it back to four-two.

A goal in each half saw **Brentwood Town** win at **Enfield**. Matt Cripps opened the scoring after fourteen minutes, and the hosts resistance was broken again with twenty two minutes left, Mekhi McKenzie making it two. Town are up to seventh, two points away from the top five after a run which has brought only one defeat from eight matches.

Gorleston ended **Ipswich Wanderers** five match unbeaten run in Great Yarmouth. The Greens took the lead eleven minutes before half time through Ryan Curtis – his sixth of the season – and they made sure just before the hour, Joe Jefford making it two-nil. The Greens go ahead of their visitors, up into tenth place.

Three first half goals saw **Bury Town** put a three match losing win behind them against **Witham Town.** Luke Brown was the chief architect of victory, scoring after ten and twenty three minutes, the second a penalty and Ed Upson ended a fine first thirty six minutes with a third. That was that, the hosts climbing to fourteenth – the visitors seeing their winless run extending to six matches.

FOOTBALL IN THE PROTECTORATE

At the end of the Second World War with much of Germany reduced to rubble and global politics shaping continental Europe in ways that would define the second half of the twentieth century, football was a minor concern. But, amongst the chaos and the disorganisation, with the former Reich being carved up amongst the victorious allied powers, was the odd case of Saarland. While East Germany fell under Soviet control, and West Germany was divided between Britain, France, and the United States, the Saar stood out. West of Kaiserslauten, right on the French border, and under French control until 1935, it had been a bit of an early refuge from Nazi terror before the war, and once again fell under French control, with the aim of detaching it from the German state.

For sport, this was complicated. Saarland competed as an independent state in the 1952 Olympics, and in qualification for the 1954 World Cup (where they lost out on a place to eventual champions West Germany). Domestic football was cut off from Germany as well, having its own incredibly weak, largely propagandised puppet league set up. But local giants Saarbrucken had competed at the top of the German game right up until 1943 (when they subsumed into the military) and had won the postwar regional league in 1946. When the Saarland Ehrenliga was set up in 1948, they were too strong and instead placed in the French second division.

There is some confusion as to what happened next. Most reports say they competed for the French Second Division title, but UEFA's official account is a little different. While Saarbrucken would indeed spend the following season playing French teams, they were unable to collect points and were essentially playing a series of competitive friendlies. What isn't in doubt is the quality of the former German side. Whether or not they were awarded points, they racked up enough wins to have won the league at a canter, much to the annoyance of their French counterparts who, understandably, didn't enjoy being beaten by what they saw as a German team, so soon after the German occupation of France had ended.

With such dominance, it was only natural for Saarbrucken to apply to join the French First Division, with the support of French Football Federation President Jules RImet, but there were some obvious problems. The anti-German sentiment was stronger in France than anywhere else west of the Iron Curtain, and nobody wanted to reward them for success with a promotion. Strasbourg in particular, who had been forced to play in the German league under the Nazi occupation, were vehemently opposed to Saarbrucken in the same league as them. Additionally, nobody in France wanted to run the risk of German champions in their own league. The application was denied, and Saarbrucken withdrew from the French league altogether. Rimet resigned.

Instead, Saarbrucken embarked on a series of friendly games, including setting up the Saarland International Cup in 1949. Seen by some as a precursor to the European Cup that would follow a few years later, the first edition included teams from all around central Europe, and a number of French teams. Saarbrucken won the competition, seeing off French side Rennes in the final, but interest in the cup diminished in the second season. Jules Rimet's Red Star, the small Parisian side, joined the 23 team competition, but it was made up mostly of German sides. This would prove a sign of things to come, and the cup was never completed as it was agreed that Saarland's football system would be reintegrated into West Germany's in 1952.

Which should, really, have brought an end to the curious case of Saarbrucken. Back in the German leagues, and with Saarland increasingly pushing toward rejoining West Germany politically as well as in footballing

terms. But the Saar wouldn't achieve that goal until 1957, after rejecting an offer of complete independence. That meant, as an independent protectorate with its own UEFA membership, there was still time for Saarbrucken to sneak into the first ever European Cup.

Travelling to an impressive Milan side in the first round, a Milan side containing superstars like Gunnar Nordahl and Nils Liedholm, nobody gave Saarbrucken any chance at all. Not that the Saarlanders were overawed by their illustrious opponents. They took the lead after five minutes, before Milan got into their rhythm and scored three before half-time. But Saarbrucken responded like a freight train, scoring three of their own to take a 4-3 lead back to West Germany. Beating Milan a second time would prove a step too far, however, and they lost the second leg 4-1, ending their brief time in the European sun.

Saarbrucken reached the national final on their return to the German football system, losing to Stuttgart, and continued to be a strong presence in their regional league. Upon the creation of the Bundesliga in 1963, they were included; albeit controversially. They finished bottom, and spent the next 30 years bouncing between the divisions, before finally slipping into the fourth tier in 2006. But they will always have France, and Milan, and a curious chapter in the story of postwar football.
