However the flag went up for offside, it appeared to be a very tight decision. The rest of the half the goalkeepers had little to do until the 35th minute when goalkeeper debutant Charlie Binns, pushed for a corner a deflected shot that was heading for the top corner, this was the first corner of the game. 0 - 0 at half and very little between the teams.

The second half started with a bang as Salamis took the lead in the 48th minute when Hercules cottoned onto a through ball and fired across the goal, giving Binns little chance to make a

save. 1-0 to Salamis, Felixstowe were struggling to make any real inroads as Salamis looked well organised and were denying Felixstowe any real chances. With 17 minutes to go Felixstowe brought on subs. Otley-Gooch and Mayhew and changed their formation, going three at the back. The changes did see a resurgence in Felixstowe's performance, spending a lot more time in Salamis half and forcing several corners.

This paid dividends in the 85th minute when **Callum Harrison** beat the keeper with a shot from the edge of the penalty area that flew into the bottom corner of the net giving the keeper no chance. Felixstowe were well on top now but couldn't find a winner.

Charlie Binns looks a good acquisition in goal on loan from Ipswich Town. New Salamis belied their lowly position in the league and a loss on today's performance would have been harsh on them while Felixstowe will be disappointed with how they played apart from the last quarter of the game.

PARTNERS WITH ISTHMIAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE THE OTHER SIDE MALDON & TIPTREE

Maldon & Tiptree FC was formed in 2010 when Maldon Town and Tiptree United were amalgamated by owner Ed Garty playing in the Isthmian Division One North.

The newly formed Clubs first season ended with them finishing in 8th place however the following season was not as successful and joint Managers, Brad King and Glen Knight were replaced by ex- Charlton professional Mike Flanagan steering the Club to a respectful mid-table finish.

At the beginning of the 2012-13 campaign, ex-Stansted & Redbridge manager Terry Spillane was appointed as Manager and ex-Tiptree United manager, Jody Brown joined as Spillane's assistant. The Club earned a place in the play-offs losing to Thamesmead Town on penalties in the final.

In 2014 Alan Kimble was appointed as Manager and it was a difficult season finishing the season in 19th place.

During the 2014-15 season a competition was run with supporters voting for a Club nickname. The Jammers was the clear winner with over 50% of the vote.

In 2015 the Club formed a relationship with Colchester Utd and David Wright was appointed as 1st Team Manager however in December 2015 Wright moved to Colchester Utd and Liam Bailey took charge of the team on a temporary basis. During 2016, Steve Ball was appointed Manager and led the club to a respectable 7th place just missing out on the play-offs. As the season ended Ball moved to Colchester Utd Kevin Horlock was brought in to replace him ending the season in 2nd place. Horlock's side reached the play-off final, where they lost to Thurrock.

After managing 112 games, Kevin Horlock departed and was replaced by ex-Colchester defender, Wayne Brown for the 2018-19 season. In Brown's first season, the Jammers finished in 2nd place and reached the play-off final, where they agonisingly lost on penalties against local rivals, Heybridge Swifts.

The 2019-20 season was one to remember for



the Club. An incredible run in the Emirates FA Cup saw the Jammers reach the First Round proper with Maldon & Tiptree travelling to League Two side, Leyton Orient, joined by over 600 fans.

Goals from Danny Parish and a superb solo goal from Jorome Slew saw victory for the Jammers earning then a home fixture against Football League side Newport County in the Second Round proper. The match was televised live on national television and attracted a record home attendance at Park Drive of 1,876 seeing the Jammers only beaten by the League Two side with a goal in stoppage time.

With Maldon & Tiptree riding high in the league, finding themselves top of the Isthmian Division One North, 13 points clear with four games in hand, disaster struck with the season being expunged as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic, the Club were denied a chance of promotion.

In October 2020, Club owner and Chairman, Ed Garty stood down from his position. General Manager, Ron Dangerfield was confirmed as the new Chairman, with Richard Cowling taking ownership of the Club.

The 2020-21 season was terminated with promotion and relegation denied again. Prior to the termination of the season, the Jammers reached the Emirates FA Cup First Round proper for the

Maldon & Tiptree Football Club – History. 1 second successive season, this time losing to Morecambe 1-0 in front of the television cameras and achieved their longest ever run in the Buildbase FA Trophy before losing to Gloucester City.

Midway through the 2021-22 season, Brown moved to Colchester Utd having managed 141 games and a win percentage of 68% and his former assistant, Paul Abrahams, took over steering the Jammers to 9th place.

At the end of the season, Ron Dangerfield left the club and Jerry Carter came in as Chairman from Braintree Town.

A difficult start to the 2022-23 season saw Paul Abrahams departing with Liam Bailey again stepping up as interim-Manager. Adam Flint became manager for a short tenure of just 9 matches.

Daniel Barber was named as new Chairman in December 2022 and shortly afterwards Peter Taylor was appointed as team Manager. Peter Taylor departed the Club in August 2023 and Liam Bailey was appointed on a permanent basis as his replacement with Rui Costa joining shortly afterwards as his assistant.



PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH ROUND UP

We had a late winner for Bowers, a Witham comeback win, whilst the Seasiders and Bees had to settle for a point against New Salamis and Swifts-our Pitching In Isthmian North round up

Witham Town, fresh from winning our Performance of the Month Award for their eight goal hammering of Stowmarket Town, were full of confidence as Maldon & Tiptree headed to the Simarco Stadium on Friday evening. They went ahead on twenty seven minutes, Josh Osude making it four goal in three matches, but the Jammers quickly hit back and were ahead by the break, Louis Britton with his tenth and eleventh of the campaign - in eleven matches.

Town weren't downhearted, and Osude scored again to equalise eleven minutes after the restart, and then the hosts went ahead, Liam Whipps making it three-two with twenty two minutes to go. Try as they might, the Jammers couldn't get an equaliser, and Witham climbed to eleventh with their third league wins in a row.

Most of Saturday's programme was washed away, but second place **Felixstowe and Walton United** had the chance to narrow



the gap between themselves and leaders Lowestoft Town as they travelled to North London to face **New Salamis**. The Seasiders put their two match losing streak behind them last Saturday to hammer Gorleston, whilst at the same time their opponents this weekend were on the receiving end of a six-one hiding at Lowestoft, so United were undoubtedly the favourites, but they needed a late equaliser just to get a share of the points. Wranyel Hercules got his third of the season just after half time, and the visitors ensured they got something from the game when Callum Harrison levelled with five minutes left.

Basildon United, still without a manager, made the trip to Scraley Road to take on seventh place Heybridge Swifts. This was the Bees first match since their narrow defeat at Bowers & Pitsea on November 25th. which was their first loss in eight matches and the Bees looked back to their best early on, Ben Allen scoring the opening goal of the game on nine minutes. It looked like three points were secure, and they were ahead as we entered added time, but then Kane Munday made the visiting fans a little miserable with a last-gasp leveller. That's six matches between the sides since the Bees last defeated Swifts - but they've never been closer to ending that run. The Bees drop to fourth, Swifts stay seventh.

Fifth place **Bowers and Pitsea** welcomed **Wroxham** to the Len Salmon. Bowers knew that they could climb as high as third place if they could win for the fourth match in a row.

and they took the lead on the half hour, Tosan Popo with the opening goal. The Yachtsmen wouldn't take that lying down and Harry Barker levelled half an hour later - and within six minutes the visitors were ahead, Jordan King with the goal. Bowers his back with eighteen minutes left on the clock, Benas Vaivada on from the bench for his fifth of the campaign, and when the visitors were reduced to ten men shortly afterwards the hosts scented blood- Travis Dodsworth the man dismissed.

Matt Price (pictured) has found his Bowers shooting boots of late, scoring three goals in his last two matches - and right at the end he continued that run, scoring a winner and sending his side up into that third spot.

CHARLTON'S BALLON D'OR DISASTER

Allan Simonsen was undeniably a great footballer. The Dane was European Footballer of the Year in 1977, beating out the likes of Kevin Keegan and Johan Cruyff to the award. He played for Barcelona, had been their top goalscorer and found the winning goal in the Cup Winners Cup final, securing a much needed European trophy for the Catalan side. But when they paid a world record fee for Diego Maradona in 1982, it threw his position into doubt. Spanish football at the time allowed only two European players on the pitch at the time. The Argentine would obviously start, and when it became clear that Bernd Schuster would as well, Simonsen took his leave of the club for new pastures. Nobody could have expected those pastures to be... Charlton Athletic.

Simonsen had offers from across Europe, but the front runners turned out to be Barcelona's hated rivals Real Madrid, and Tottenham Hotspur. Given the tensions between the two Spanish sides, North London seemed the most likely prospect for the Dane, where Spurs had just achieved their highest finish in a decade and were looking at pushing beyond the fourth place they had found themselves in the previous season. But then Simonsen threw a spanner into those plans, stating that he would enjoy a more relaxed footballing environment, something that White Hart Lane didn't really offer. Struggling at the wrong end of the Second Division, Charlton owner Mark Hulyer took his chance, blowing both Tottenham and Real Madrid out of the water with a £325,000 bid. Barcelona accepted on one condition: all of the money was paid up front. They didn't trust in Mark Hulyer's vision any more than anyone else.

The Valley at that time could take 75,000, but hadn't seen even 40,000 for 35 years. Charlton averaged 7000 fans for their home games, but Hulyer wasn't content to sit at that level. The colossal bid for Simonsen, with high salary (by Second Division standards) and no bank to help finance the deal, was a gamble, but the interest he would generate, and the success he would bring, would boost attendances so considerably that he would soon repay the money on the pitch. It was an idea with sadly predictable consequences.

Initially, Hulyer was right, to an extent. 4000 fans turned up for the reserve game where Simonsen would first kick a ball in a Charlton shirt, and more than 10,000 saw him play his first game for the first team, a gate increase of 50%. And Simonsen, European Footballer of the Year only five years earlier, took to his new team with ease. That first game ended in defeat against Middlesbrough, but Charlton fans saw their star signing score his first goal, and create chance after chance for his teammates.

Having dropped from the pinnacle of European Football to the Second Division, the Dane's first 16 games for the club saw a slight upturn in fortunes for Charlton. He scored nine goals, providing more for his teammates, and usually won man of the match; not a huge surprise for a player deemed a peer of Johan Cruyff. But it was also a frustrating experience for Simonsen. His new teammates were not up to his speed, and incisive through balls, inch-perfect crosses, and magical moments were wasted by teammates who were always behind him. He couldn't do it alone, as evidenced by a 7-1 drubbing against Burnley.

Simonsen did have bright moments, the most notable against Chelsea following that Burnley game. Charlton took a two goal lead in the first half, but let it slip before the hour. Simonsen took charge of the game after that, gliding around the pitch as though he were still a Barcelona player, beating Chelsea defenders that, like most in the Second Division, were far below his level, and scoring two goals, creating another, for a 5–2 win. He had also doubled the attendance at Charlton, to a peak of 13000, but it wasn't enough. Just five months after signing him, the south London galactico was causing financial problems. Hulyer was looking to sell.

Offloading a Ballon d'Or winner was a simpler, but much less profitable, prospect for Charlton than it had been for Barcelona. Fearing this exact situation, Simonsen's agent had put a release clause into the contract he had signed. When Hulyer approached him to explain that they couldn't afford his wages, the agent triggered the clause and Simonsen left the club in January of 1983. He went back to his homeland, and joined his childhood club VB to see out his relaxed career. Things for Charlton were not so cosy.

Facing the massive financial losses of the Simonsen experiment, Charlton were soon also given an even bigger tax bill of more than £400,000. The club finished that season five places lower than they had the previous, and facing bankruptcy. The club was placed into administration and force to leave The Valley altogether, to share Selhurst Park with Crystal Palace.

So the signing of Allan Simonsen did have the huge impact on Charlton that Hulyer had claimed, just not the one he had hoped for.
