Good afternoon everyone, a warm welcome to the AGL Arena for today's Isthmian North encounter with Basildon United.

Our visitors today have enjoyed one of their best seasons to date for many a year, sitting in 6th place, very much looking to be in the mix for a play-off place. I don't see them coming to thr AGL today and giving us anything on the cheap, we will need to win our individual battles and as a collective to ensure we get something from the match.

With Lowestoft winning another game in hand during the week we find ourselves five points behind the leaders, so it's vitally important to stay in touch with another three points today, particularly after our super impressive victory over the leaders in our last league encounter.

being dirty or being especially tough but for just being a top class, non-league footballer who consistently produces 8/10 performances week in week out, whether at the back, middle of the park or on the odd occasion leading the front line, although for me, centre back is his best position.

FROM THE DUGOUT:
ANDY CRUMP



Welcome back to the AGL Arena for this afternoon's fixture with Basildon United and a warm welcome to AJ, his coaching staff and players.

The quality of the performance last time out pleased the Gaffa and I for so many reasons. The quality within the group is unquestionable but as a staff group we still have a responsibility to make sure the squad goes into fixtures equipped to have the best chance of claiming those vital three points available.

Stuart has mentioned the work that went into our prep for Lowestoft so I thought I would give a little insight to what goes into the prep for games like today. It all normally starts with reviewing oppositions recent results, using connections within the league to get insights on performances, sometimes sending scouts to watch them in the week leading up to the game and using the level of social media content that is becoming more and more available.



We then pull it all together and spend time ensuring our training and match prep sets the team up with a clear plan. It can often come with a few roles of the eyes from our wives as we regularly end up speaking multiple times in a day to make sure we have it right.

Lowestoft wasn't any different to a normal week but it did come with a satisfaction that once Callum Harrison had put the result to bed, we could stand and enjoy the final few minutes reflecting on the satisfaction of two weeks of hard work paying off!

There was a similar satisfaction at Brentwood seven days earlier, but for different reasons. Preparation followed its normal form but on arrival at the ground, the weather conditions meant we had to think quickly, adjust (change personnel, adjust set pieces, tactical adjustments to our shape) and prep the squad in 45 minutes before kick off.

The players deserve a huge amount of credit though and with such a talented group they are able to adapt quickly in those situations as well as they can take on information over a couple of training sessions in the lead up to games. What is evident is this group wants to win and achieve things for our football club and that rightly comes with them having high expectations of the coaching team to give them the best environments and platform to win. Another big plus this week has been the move to a new training facility we have recently developed at my day job, Inspire - meaning we have a much improved facility for training.

Back to today and looking at our oppositions season so far, they deserve huge credit and I am sure AJ will build on the impressive start to the season that Darren made before moving onto Grays. We have often said of how important the three points were back in September and I hope we can maintain the same levels as last time out and enjoy watching the boys at their very best!

SEASIDER PHIL GRIFFITHS



Not many people know this...

Speaking to fellow Vice President Chris Ryan in the week, he reminded me about 'the old days' at Dellwood Avenue with Ben the Dog who became a quite famous celebrity around the league grounds, getting his picture in the local football paper (Green 'Un) for being an avid watcher of the Seaside. He sat behind the goal in his Felixstowe scarf, eyes fixed on the ball, wherever it went.

He was here the foggy night we reached our attendance low point, when a game against Clacton Town kicked off in decreasing visibility, with the official attendance at kick off a grand total of FIVE which included Ben the Dog!

The game was abandoned quite early, but no one told the five hardy watchers who thought the game was a bit one sided as they weren't seeing much of the play from where they were standing, only when the floodlights started to go out did they discover the game had been abandoned, and the gates were due to be locked imminently.

How Times Change ... From 5 to 500 plus... It's all about the numbers, looking back just over the last decade at the figures coming through the gate to watch the Seaside play football - in 2013/14 playing in the Eastern Counties League Premier Division our average gate was 114 and our top gate just 204.

Currently in 2023/24 our average home gate is 376 which is third highest in the division behind Bury Town (538) and Lowestoft Town (422), the two clubs we need to use as our marker for where we want to get to as our next level and we attracted over 2,000 when we hosted Ipswich Town for a pre-season friendly back in July.

If we could consistently serve up the level of football the side produced in our last home game, then I think our average gate would be pushing up around that 400 mark sooner rather than later!



BILLY HOLLAND **MIDFIELDER**

Billy started life at Ipswich Wanderers and has had spells at Needham, Leiston and AFC Sudbury. He's established himself as a mainstay in the centre of midfield. Players player and Supporters player of the year last season has led to him being appointed captain for the forthcoming year.



NOEL AITKENS **MIDFIELDER**

THE OTHER SIDE BASILDON UNITED FC

Nicknamed 'The Bees', Basildon United came into being in 1967, having previously been known as Armada Sports; a junior club who were formed four years earlier.

In 1967/68 the renamed club joined the Grays and Thurrock League, moving into the Greater London League the following season.

The first major step forward came in 1970 when the Essex County FA granted the club senior status and it became a founder member of the Essex Senior League.

It was not long before The Bees got amongst the honours recording four consecutive championships from 1977 until 1980, which stands as a league record to this day.

In addition, Basildon finished runners-up in 1973 and 1975, whilst the League Cup was won in 1978 to complete that season's double. The following season the club were winners of the Essex Senior Trophy.

The Bees successfully applied for promotion to the Athenian League in 1980, but membership only lasted one season, as they finished runners up to Windsor and Eton and earned promotion to the Isthmian League Division 2. In this season, Basildon also progressed to the quarter finals of the FA Vase, before Irthlingborough Diamonds brought an end to progress in the competition with a 6-4 victory in a sixth-round replay.

After three seasons in the Isthmian League Division 2, Basildon achieved promotion as champions in 1984, pipping St Albans City by one point on the last day of the season. This season additionally saw the club reach the finals of both the Essex Senior Trophy and the Eastern Floodlight Competition.

Basildon found life a lot harder in the first division and eventually lost the struggle against relegation in 1989, dropping into the



Isthmian League Division 2 North. This was the first time that the club had suffered relegation in their history.

Two further seasons were spent in Division 2 North before the decision to de-regionalise the division led to the club resigning from the league, the club considering that an excess of travelling in the Isthmian League was not viable at that point.

The Bees re-joined the Essex Senior League in 1991/92 and quickly regrouped both on and off the pitch. It was not long before the successes of the late seventies were emulated, as The Bees finished in the top six in both 1991/92 and 1992/93 and made a League Cup final appearance in 1992.

A superb 1993/94 season saw Basildon again win the Essex Senior League double, with the championship being won for a record fifth time. The following season, 1994/95, the club battled through to the FA Vase quarter final for the second time in its history, before losing out to Raunds Town.

During 1997/98, The Bees equalled Brentwood's record of three Essex Senior League Cup wins by beating Burnham Ramblers 1-0 in the final. It was the club's sixth appearance in the final of this competition, which also remains a record. In the league, Basildon finished runners up to Concord Rangers.

1999/2000 saw Basildon finish 13th, which was the club's worst league finish at the time and although a reasonable 8th position was achieved in 2000/01, two bottom half finishes followed for the next two seasons. The club finished 7th in both 2003/04 and 2004/05.

John Higley was The Bees manager at the start of the 2007/08 season, but he was replaced by Jason Emery in October. The club struggled for form all season and used 72 players, only to finish in 16th position, just one place off the bottom.

A new management team of Colin Cook and Gary Morris was announced for the 2008/09 season and the club won its first six matches, whilst reaching the second-round proper of the FA Vase. However, by December



the management team had left the club and ex reserve coach, Jody Prewell, was appointed manager, with Basildon eventually finishing the season in 8th place.

Prewell left the club by mutual consent in April 2010 and was replaced by Sean Merchant as caretaker manager. The Bees suffered the heaviest defeat to date on 24 April, losing 10-0 at Witham Town. The club eventually finished the season in 12th place.

In May 2010, John Doyle returned to the club as manager, bringing in former Romford boss, Mark Reed as his assistant and Paul Rogan as coach.

After a 12th place finish, John Doyle decided to step down at the end of the 2010/11 season. The club advertised for a new manager and in excess of 30 hopefuls applied, with Paul Larke being appointed manager in June 2011.

After a poor start to the season, Larke resigned following a 9-1 defeat at Witham Town, with John Doyle returning to oversee the forthcoming FA Vase match against Amphyll Town.

The following week, Chris Wood was appointed permanent manager, but unfortunately no improvement was seen in results and The Bees finished bottom of the Essex Senior League for the first time in the club's history.

Former Ramsden boss, Bobby Barnes, was appointed manager in May 2012 and at just 27 was one of the youngest managers in non-league football. After Barnes decided to resign due to work commitments, John Higley returned to the club and was assisted by Steve Brown senior.

After a number of managerial changes, the club ended the 2012/13 season with Bertie Brayley as player/manager and the club finished the season in 13th position. Laurie Carter was appointed manager for the 2013/14 season and the club finished in 8th position.

In May 2014 Colin Cook returned to the club for a second spell as manager and he was assisted by Craig Gillam. Cook left during





September being replaced by his assistant, who guided The Bees to a creditable 12th place finish.

Ahead of the 2015/16 season, Lee Connor was appointed as assistant to Gillam and the club enjoyed its best season for many years winning the League Challenge Cup and finishing runners up in the league. Additionally, Brad Warner won the league's Golden Boot award.

With Gillam opting not to remain with the club for the 2016/17 season, the club appointed Aaron Bloxham as manager, who had previously enjoyed success with White Ensign in the Essex Olympian League. A mid-table finish was achieved in the league as well as notable success in the Essex Senior Cup where the club reached the last eight before bowing out against Heybridge Swifts in the quarter finals.

In May 2017 the club parted ways with Bloxham and Marc Harrison joined the club as manager, with Liam Wallace also joining

as his assistant. Harrison and Wallace both joined the club from neighbours Basildon Town, where they had achieved considerable success winning Essex Olympian League Division One the previous season.

In their first season in charge, Harrison and Wallace enjoyed tremendous success leading the club to the runners-up spot in the league and with it promotion back to the Isthmian League for the first time in 27 years. Following a club reorganisation, Harrison and Wallace left the club in November 2018 and after a brief spell as Joint Manager with former Barking side manager, Michael Walther, Lee Connor took temporary charge of team affairs. Subsequently, former Enfield 1893 and Laindon Orient manager, Neil Blackburn, took on the role as first team manager.

Blackburn stepped down as manager before the end of the 2018/19 season to be replaced by John Sussex who re-joined the club from Witham Town, having previously been a coach at the club. Sussex departed the club in November 2019 and after two short term caretaker appointments, Burnham Ramblers manager Alex Salmon was brought into the role with a view to building a new side focussed on much needed stability.

However, Salmon's tenure was to be short lived as he resigned after the first game of the 2020/21 season and former Bowers & Pitsea U23 manager John Guyton was appointed to the position to continue the work that had begun under his predecessor.

After a run of below par results, Guyton left the club in November 2021 and Jon Fowell was appointed as his successor. Due to personal reasons, Fowell left his position in January 2022 and local lad Marc Benterman was appointed in his place.

With Benterman moving on in October 2022, former Hullbridge Sports duo Darren Manning and James Wakeling were appointed to the lead the side, with Manning subsequently taking sole charge following Wakeling's departure, to continue the club's exciting journey.

ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

THIS week, we had the pleasure of talking to Warrington Town goalkeeper Dan Atherton, who has discovered a rather handy penchant for scoring goals.

Golden boy Dan, the former New Saints and Hyde United stopper, netted the first goal of his career back in October to earn Mark Beesley's side a last-gasp 1-1 home draw with Farsley Celtic in National League North.

And he was at it again a fortnight ago, popping up to dramatically head home another last-minute leveller for the Wire in a 2-2 draw with Alfreton Town.

Somewhat humbly, Dan put his goalscoring prowess down to being in the right place at the right time, but whether you wear the number one jersey or 100, having that natural predatory instinct is an art in itself.

"I have no idea where it's come from, it's certainly not planned," Atherton told us. "I'm just glad to be able to contribute to the team. Even when I go up for a corner, I'm not really intending to score; I'm just looking to take a runner or two away and cause a bit of chaos. Fortunately, I've managed to get my head on a couple and they've gone in!"

A Liverpool trainee from the age of 11, Atherton learned his trade from the very top and put his ball skills down to working at the Melwood Training Ground with Pepijn Lijnders, the Reds' former Under 16 coach who is now Jurgen Klopp's first-team assistant.

There, he trained alongside Brazilian first choice keeper Allison, who famously scored a

95th-minute winner for Liverpool at West Bromwich Albion in May 2021 to earn Klopp's men a Champions League place.

While most goalkeepers would just be pleased to get on the scoresheet once in their careers, it's actually not as unusual as you might think.

Just having that extra strapping body in the box for a last-gasp corner or free-kick is enough to throw opposition defences, even more so these days with goalkeepers coached to be as comfortable with the ball at their feet than their outfield counterparts.

Who can remember enigmatic Paraguayan José Luis Chilavert? He was a free-kick expert for club and country and scored 67 times during his career, including eight for Paraguay. He is also the only goalkeeper ever to score a hat-trick.

The record for most goals scored by goalkeeper is held by the Brazilian Rogério Ceni, with 129. He scored his 100th goal in a 3-0 win for São Paulo on in 2011.

Two goalkeeper records, however, have been set in English football. On November 2 2013, Stoke City goalkeeper Asmir Begović recorded the fastest goalkeeper goal in football history (13 seconds), while Newport County's Tom King scored from the longest distance – 96.01 metres, in a match against Cheltenham Town in January 2021.

So, the next time your team are a goal down and in need of a saviour, don't be surprised to see your big number one surging up the field to provide some divine intervention. Like Dan Atherton, he could be your unlikely hero.

The Avanhard Stadium was supposed to hold 11,000 diehard supporters for its side. Newly built, it was supposed to be the symbol of a Stalinist regeneration in the area, led first by Leonid Brezhnev and then by a succession of Soviet General Secretaries. The side was founded by builders, who had been relocated to the area to construct the socialist utopia their leaders had imagined, an occupation found in their name - Stroitel Pripyat. The club had spent its decade of existence in the fourth division, but with a new ground, an excited and enthusiastic fanbase, and backing from Moscow, hopes were high that the future would be bright. But the stadium was never used. In 1986, just a week before it was due to be opened, disaster struck. Because the centrepiece of Prip'yat's

regeneration, the reason for the builder's being moved to the town in the first place, was V. I. Lenin Nuclear Power Plant. Chernobyl.

When Brezhnev declared Prip'yat to be a new atomgrad - a nuclear city - he could not have imagined how prophetic his words would be. Construction was started in 1972, and completed five years later. In the middle, builders who were conscripted for the project found they had little to do with their free time, so started a football team. Founded in the nearby village of Chistogaovka, Stroitel displaced the amateur side that was already in place, absorbing their fans and some of their players into the new club, as the population grew past 50,000. They were slowly joined by players from all over Ukraine, including Stanislav Honcharenko,

who would later enter the Ukrainian Hall of Fame. By 1979, the power plant was completed and operational, but the builders stayed, this time building their lives in Pripjat, and continued playing for and supporting Stroitel.

By the new decade, Stroitel Pripjat were becoming something of a local force. They finished strongly in the fourth tier between 1981 and 1984, but couldn't quite reach high enough to secure professional status for the club. But the announcement of a new stadium, they were convinced, would change that. In 1986, Stroitel went on an unprecedented run in the Ukrainian Cup, reaching the semi-finals and beginning to believe that destiny would deliver them the trophy, just as they moved into their new stadium. Fate, however, had other plans.

On the morning of 26th April 1986, Stroitel's players were going through some light training on the pitch of their existing stadium, warming up and preparing for what was expected to be a tough tie against FK Borodyanka later that afternoon. A helicopter flew overhead, and then to the confusion of the players, came down to land on the pitch. Men, wearing protective suits, disembarked. While some inspected their instruments, others made their way over to the training players. There would be no football today. There had been an accident at Chernobyl. Radiation levels were already too high.

The incompetence and corruption of the Soviet leadership meant that it would be another two days before the players - and everybody else in Pripjat - were evacuated to where the radiation levels were safe. Some returned soon afterwards as part of the cleanup

crew, half a million volunteers, whose heroic efforts belied the wilful mistakes of their leaders. It wouldn't be an exaggeration to suggest that their heroic efforts in preventing a meltdown saved pretty much the entire continent - fallout from such a disaster would have reached as far as the UK, covering the rest of Europe in between - at the cost of their own health.

The remaining players moved the club 30 miles east of the Dnieper River, to Slavutych, where they made an effort to reestablish themselves. Fans struggled to make the journey, but the players, brought together by the disaster, managed to finish third in the following season. But falling crowds, a lack of investment and - crucially - health problems caused by the accident at Chernobyl, the team disbanded for good in 1988.

The exclusion zone is a tourist attraction now, for those brave or foolhardy enough to enter it. The Chernobyl Power Plant itself was so badly irradiated that it won't be safe to enter for another 20,000 years. Pripjat is a ghost town, a terrifying reminder of what corruption and incompetence can cause. The official Soviet death toll from the disaster was around 30. The highest estimate is nearly 100,000.

The loss of a small amateur football team, who had existed for barely a decade and had won exactly nothing, is largely an insignificance compared to such a number of deaths. But in the middle of the exclusion zone, overgrown and forever empty, sits the Avanhard Stadium. A symbol of what might have been.
