

opefully today will be one of those good days all football clubs like - as I write this there is no rain forecast (Wednesday), bit of sun and ok temperature (for the time of year), Ipswich Town at home, they kicked off at 12:30 so the guys who support both clubs can watch the Tractor Boys then get back here to the AGL to see the majority of this game!

Both sides are in good form, with Walthamstow winning in midweek 2-0 over Wroxham while we remain unbeaten since the turn of the year.

Both clubs have been averaging over 300 per home game, with our visitors splitting the

four Suffolk Clubs. Bury Town lead the way with a home average of 546, followed by Lowestoft Town on 410 - we are third on 373 and Walthamstow with a 315 average, struggling Stowmarket making up the five teams in the North Division with a better than 300 average on 302.

The players certainly enjoy a big supportive crowd at home games and are equally impressed when 50 travel to places like Redbridge to make up 60% of the attendance. Hopefully as we begin the run in we can garner more support, particularly for home games and make the AGL Arena the fortress it needs to be if we are to make the play-offs.

## THE OTHER SIDE WALTHAMSTOW FC

The history of our great club is not what you'd call straightforward. Having reformed on at least three occasions, we've played under seven different names, but can lay claim to being the second-oldest club in London, and one of the oldest in the country.

The initial Leyton FC was formed in 1868 when The Reverent Morgan Lloyd obtained a pitch behind The Lion & Dehind The Lion & Dehind The Lion & Dehind Triendlies, but did take part in the FA Cup, before folding in 1880 when they lost their ground.

Seven years later, the members of Matlock Cricket Club, based on Hoe Street established a football club named after the Matlock Villas, which overlooked the club's pitch. In 1894, Swifts moved out of Leyton, to a new ground in Blackhorse Road, Walthamstow. This lasted just a season though, as the club moved back to Leyton and changed their name to Leyton FC in the process.

The club won the Essex Senior Cup on no fewer than five occasions, and the London Senior Cup, as well as the South Essex League four times.

Leyton turned professional in 1904, joining the London League. The following year, Leyton moved to Osborne Road, which would later become Leyton Orient's Brisbane Road.

In April 1912 a loan by a donor was called-in, and without any hope of paying it, the club disbanded for a second time.

Only a year later a third Leyton was formed, but this incarnation was extremely short-lived. The outbreak of war meant there was essentially no one to watch or play for the club, and it was suspended.



The fourth Leyton was established in 1919, and it would be arguably the most successful period for the club, now back at the Hare and Hounds. Leyton won the FA Amateur Cup (now FA Trophy) twice, and were runners-up on four more occasions. They also reached the first round of the FA Cup four times and the second round three times.

After a successful 1950s and 60s, things dried up for Leyton, and by the 1970s they could not carry on, so a merger was completed with Wingate from north London.

The pinnacle of this club was winning the Athenian League in 1982, but by the early 90s with most of the former 'Wingate' committee now either deceased or having had left, the newly-merged Wingate & Camp; Finchley requested Leyton drop the 'Wingate' title from their name.

By 1995, the Hare & Depth Samp; Hounds was really beginning to show its age, and with Leyton not having the funds to bring it up to standard, a merger was completed with Walthamstow Pennant, with the new club being Leyton Pennant and playing at Wadham Lodge.

This club spent most of its life in Divisions
One and Two of the Isthmian League, with no
notable success, save for two London
Challenge Cup final appearances. Its first
season in 1995 saw the club finish 4th in
Division One, but it was mostly mid-table
obscurity after that.

In 2003 the club changed names to Waltham Forest and were bankrolled heavily with aspirations of playing in the Football League. Sadly, these never came to fruition and an Essex Senior Cup was the only thing to show for it.

Disputes with the then-management at Wadham Lodge in 2008 saw the club exiled for five seasons, playing in liford. The first



season back at Wadham Lodge, in 2013 ended in relegation to the Essex Senior League for the first time in the club's history.

In 2018, the club changed names once more to Walthamstow FC. This kick-started the club and saw the highest attendances in many years, and a third-placed finish in the Essex Senior League, the club's highest finish since the 1980s.

After two seasons cut short by the Covid-19 pandemic, Stow finally secured promotion from step five by winning the Essex Senior League title in 2022, the club's first league win for 37 years. Managers Terry Spillane and John Mackie were unable to build on their title-winning campaign and were relieved of their duties a month into the 2022-23 season. Experienced manager Nicky Ironton was brought in, and took the club from 16th at Christmas, to a play-off place in the club's first season back at step four.

Unfortunately, after an inconsistent start to the 2023-24 season, Stow and Ironton amicably parted ways.



**Bury Town**, eleven games unbeaten and in fourth place at kick off, looked to continue that run at **Brightlingsea Regent** - and they

couldn't have had a better start, Cemal Ramadan scoring his twenty first goal of the season to put them ahead after seven minutes. Ramadan added another ten minutes after half time, and although Regent quickly got one back through Kojo Apenteng Ramadan went straight back up the other end and completed his hat trick on sixty one minutes, putting Town three-one ahead. The next goal was crucial, and it went to the visitors, Ed Upson putting them four-one up, and that turned out to be that, another fine Town victory.

Gorleston welcomed high flying Brentwood Town, and the Greens broke through the Blues rearguard after just twelve minutes, Joe Jefford with the goal. The visitors, seven unbeaten at kick off, hit back five minutes before half time, Mekhi McKenzie continuing his fine form with a ninth goal in thirteen games, but the next goal went the way of the hosts, Ryan Curtis putting Gorleston ahead once more eight minutes after half time. Again Town hit back, Shad Ngandu making it two-two with twenty six minutes left, and they went ahead for the first time with six minutes to go, Jonathan Nzengo sending the visiting fans wild. That, finally, was that- the Blues holding onto to fifth place.

**Heybridge Swifts**, trying to get back on an even keel after two defeats, welcomed **New** 

Salamis - and fell behind after forty seven minutes, Panny Boxer with the opener. The visitors gave the hosts hope when Tommy Boxer saw red with twenty three minutes to go, and they capitalised, Jack Adlington-Pile equalising almost immediately. Right at the end the eleven men had three points, Kieran Jones scoring from the spot to make it two-one Swifts, who are three points and one place outside the play off places.

Basildon United, under new management, gave their new boss something to smile about when Clyde Semazzi opened the scoring on fourteen minutes against Witham Town. His grin must have grown when Samir Ali made it two just before the break, and when Callum Fitzer made it three soon after half time the Bees were well and truly buzzing. It got even worse for Town when Josh Osude saw red, and their bad day got even worse when Samir Ali added a fourth. That's where

the goals stopped, and the Bees are five points shy of the top five.

Maldon & Tiptree wanted to quickly put their defeat against Bury Town in midweek behind them, and they went ahead at Enfield just after the break, George Smith seventeenth of the season doing the damage. That turned out to be that, the Jammers eighth, five points away from the top five.

**Grays Athletic**, looking to build on their midweek victory, welcomed **Wroxham** to Tilbury - but they didn't have the best of starts, the Yachtsmen making the breakthrough after only eight minutes through Josh Harvey. It looked as if the visitors were sailing home with three points, but right at the end new arrival Elliot Sartorius earned Athletic a point.

### KUBANISCH FUSSBALL

Bonner SC are perennial strugglers. They have spent almost their entire existence in the third and fourth tiers of German football, the kind of history that invokes a fierce loyalty from a small fanbase with little hope of glory. The club, like most in their position, try to make the most of even the merest opportunity to improve, no matter how seemingly absurd or questionable. In the aftermath of the 1998 World Cup, Brazil hosted a friendly game against the communist Caribbean nation of Cuba. Their players, all amateurs playing domestically, put up a fight against the new world champions, succumbing to a creditable 2-0 defeat. Bonner owner Hans-Robert Viol thought a few of them could add something to his struggling German side and made enquiries. He ended up with the entire squad.

Football had been popular in Cuba before Castro enacted his communist coup, but in the years following he focused his attention on the United States. They were strong in baseball and boxing, so Cuban athletic programmes were tailored to beat their large neighbours at their own games. Control of sport was centralised, and professionalism was banned. Any footballer who was good enough to receive a professional offer from abroad was required to reject it, or to defect and give up their chances of playing for the national team. Cuba, as a footballing entity, suffered.

When Viol made his approach, he thought of signing a handful of Cuban players. But the government didn't want to break up the squad, and demanded he take all 15 of them. The conditions were strict, but very welcome to a poor German lower league club. Food and accommodation were to be provided, and a little spending money, but under no circumstances were the players to be paid wages. Perfect for Viol.

The travelling party of 15 players was joined by a translator and a couple of coaches. Fans weren't happy about what they saw as a publicity stunt, but neither the German football authorities or the EU could find anything technically wrong with the move. Viol repaid Cuba by sending football equipment across the Atlantic, and put his new players into a training camp. The best would join the first team, and the rest would play for the reserves. For the Cubans, it was a chance to learn from European coaches at elite European facilities. Which might sound fanciful, in the German

fourth tier, but the entire nation of Cuba had just 11 footballs, so it was a significant step up.

The Cubans played in two friendlies for club, the first a 1-0 win and the second a draw. But the outcry within German football was growing too loud. Before they could make senior debuts, Franz–Josef Antwerpes, president of the district, cancelled their promised visas. But that didn't spell the end of the entire Cuban project. A couple of players were able to earn visas conventionally, and stayed in the country. Two of them played out the season, which ended in relegation, while a third, Vladimir Alejo Cordoves, stayed for three seasons.

For Cuba, there was no immediate benefit. The 2002 World Cup qualifying campaign went worse than the 1998 campaign, despite a squad boasting all three of Bonner's senior players, and a number that had made the journey. But eight years later, it would start to yield results.



When Cuba sacked another manager after another poor campaign, former Bonner coach **Reinhold Fanz** put in a phonecall to some of his Cuban contacts. Cuba would have to repay the kindness Bonner had shown in the same way – accommodation, food, and a little spending money – and Fanz agreed to take



the team into the following campaign. He was bullish about his new side's chances, declaring that while the USA and Mexico would take the first two qualification places, the third was up for grabs.

The draw couldn't have been worse though. In a group with the USA and Trinidad & Tobago, who had qualified for the 2006 World Cup, and Guatemala, who had just missed out. Cuba put up a fight – the very quality that had started the entire German affair – but it wasn't enough. They lost 3–1 at home to Trinidad, but the USA only struggled to a 1–0 win. Fanz claimed his side were the better in both games, but were held back by a lack of professionalism. He left his post in 2008.

With Cuba looking increasingly to the west, in 2013 they heeded Fanz' criticism. Cubans were allowed to sign professional contracts overseas, as long as they paid taxes on those salaries to the Cuban government. It was a major step for the national team.

A decade on, players are starting to make progress. Onel Hernandez of Norwich is perhaps the most successful, but there are Cuban players in Chile, Costa Rica, the USA, Spain, Austria and Switzerland. Maybe as World Cup campaign is finally coming to fruition. All thanks to a little German adventure.
