

Regardless of the arguments against it and the feelings of football fans outside the hallowed summit of the game, like a bad penny, it returns again and again. The argument is made that in some European countries - notably Spain - reserves are tested against senior opposition in genuinely competitive fixtures. The benefit, it follows, is that those young players are better prepared for senior football, and therefore a World Cup victory is guaranteed. Ignoring that Spain have a single World Cup in their trophy cabinet, a larger problem arises. What if those reserve teams end up playing against their senior counterparts. In Spain, in 1980, that's what happened, in the most prestigious match in the Iberian peninsula.

The Copa del Rey, The King's Cup, is the oldest national competition in Spain, and before 1991, reserve teams were allowed to take part in senior competitions. This opportunity never got them far, with most going out of the cup in the first round. Until 1980, when one - Real Madrid's Castilla - nearly went all the way.

The Spanish FA had prepared for this eventuality. Throughout the competition, clubs couldn't be drawn against each other, and if it happened then they had to be redrawn. Of course, when a reserve side came up against



one of the Spanish giants, or even a few of them consecutively, their inexperience and lack of quality would see them out of the competition. But Castilla didn't follow that logic.

Hercules were the first of the bigger teams to underestimate them. Having won the first leg 4-1, they were complacent. With the senior Real Madrid side not playing, nearly 10,000 fans turned out to watch Castilla. When Paco, who plied his senior trade at Racing Santander and Real Betis, scored two early goals, the comeback was on. Gallego leveled the tie in injury time, forcing extra time, where Valentin Cidon fired home a winner.

Despite the shockwaves the result sent through Spanish football, Athletic Club were probably feeling pretty confident when they drew the reserves in the last 16. A 0-0 draw in Madrid should have been a warning sign, but in the return leg in Bilbao, Castilla

dominated. A two goal lead was halved in injury time, but it was enough to reach the quarter-finals.

Castilla were given a tricky tie against league leaders Real Sociedad. The second Basque side they had faced were far more prepared, and dominated the first leg. The reserves were lucky to escape back to Madrid with just a 2-1 defeat, but the senior team had failed to beat Sociedad, losing 4-0 in San Sebastian. But in the Bernabeu, in front of a reported 100,000 fans (more than the senior side achieved in any game that season), Paco and then Sanchez Lorenzo scored to give Castilla the lead. The young side faced an onslaught from the league leaders, but held on to progress. Excitement was an understatement.

Castilla were becoming Spain's team. Real Madrid fans, disappointed at the senior's struggle (though they would, eventually, win the league) adopted the youngsters as the epitome of Real Madrid. Elsewhere, where Real Madrid were hated, the youngsters represented the new, post-Franco Spain of excitement and possibility.

The reserves lost the first leg of their semi-final against Sporting Gijon, third in La Liga, but once again in front of a raucous home crowd, Castilla showed their quality. Unbelievably, they had made the final. More astoundingly, so had the senior side. Real Madrid v Real Madrid. The Copa del Rey was heading to the Bernabeu.

The occasion was more of a pre-season friendly than a final. The two sides played each other on the training pitch every week, and the fans had no apprehension, because

Real Madrid had already won. Whether that was the reason, or whether the seniors knew just how good they had to be, there was no risk of Castilla actually winning the trophy.

Real Madrid - the senior side - won out 6-1 victors, but at the final whistle all 22 players celebrated together.



Castilla had one more adventure though. Reaching the final, against the league champions, meant they had qualified for the Cup Winner's Cup, becoming the first and only reserve side ever to play in Europe. They lost to West Ham over two legs in the first round, but their legacy was far longer.

Alfredo di Stefano became Real Madrid manager shortly after the Cup final. Inspired by Castilla's run, he promoted five of them to the senior team, where they would become legends. For nearly two decades, until the arrival of Florentino Perez, Real Madrid were one of the greatest promoters of youth in the game.

Castilla making their way to the final is a great story, and unlikely to ever repeated. At least, until the FA give in to Man City and Liverpool.
