Good afternoon/evening to you all and welcome to our visitors Haringey and Basildon respectively.

The last couple of weeks have certainly shown hard different and difficult our league can be at times. Fresh off the back of a fantastic win against a really good Maldon & Tiptree side we faced an Enfield side at home in the Trophy that showed real grit, determination and a solid defensive shape that we found incredibly difficult to penetrate. We got there though, just about, with a late Callum Harrison penalty and overall we felt it was no less than we deserved albeit a real slog to get there!

We then probably had what I can only describe as a game to forget – for many reasons! We once again came up against a side that had a clear game plan to sit back and defend for large periods and try to hit us on the counter. This is becoming a very common theme and I suppose shows a level of respect to us that even when at home teams are taking that approach. We dominated possession but Brightlingsea started the brighter going forwards and scored a fantastic goal. A goal that proved to be the winner because despite all of our pressure we were unable to break them down. The game was of course marred by two serious injuries to Joe and Callum, both who remain in quite a bad way (Callum with a spinal injury and Joe a knee). We will have to wait and see what their prognosis is but early signs are not looking good so our fingers are crossed and both have our best wishes for a speedy recovery.

On to Mildenhall midweek here at the Martello Ground where we ran out comfortable winners in the end. A similar pattern to that of previous games where Mildenhall sat deep and defended their box very well but a well taken goal by Josh Mayhew got us the lead that we never looked back from and three further great finishes meant a comfortable passage into the quarter finals of the Suffolk Premier Cup.



One talking point after the game was the “in my humble opinion” antiquated ruling of three subs used from five named. All the top competitions now have greater numbers and also greater ability to use the full bench. In the league we can use five from five, premier league is five from nine so it indicates that the need for more substitutes is the way to go. I have no idea why Suffolk FA are still persisting with the three from five but the biggest disappointment for me is it simply limits the number of young players able to get minutes in the competition. I felt for Hugo the other night as he has done well during the season to date but due to the way the game went and the need for minutes for others, he was left on the bench as an unused substitute. It would have been great for his development to have some game time and I hope that Suffolk FA review this because it is simply not encouraging youth development...

Hopefully, we have been able to attract a big crowd for both today's and Tuesday's fixtures as the Trophy is so important to both players and fans as well as being a real source of income for the club.

Basildon have started fantastically well in the league so I am sure they will come at us and provide a really entertaining game.

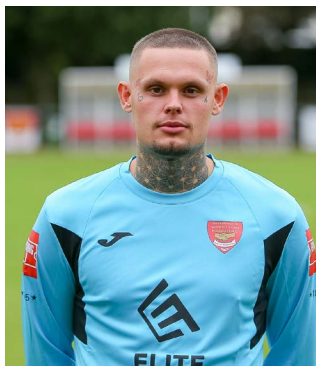

20th August 2005 – Coles Park N17 7JP – FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round

I remember it like it was 19 years ago, in truth I remember somewhat better than that, it was the first meeting between our two clubs, at the time we were in the (then) Ridgeons League 1st Division (North) and it was the start of our promotion season that saw us return to Premier Division football, and in truth the starting point of what the club is today.

We were one of a select few Division One clubs accepted into the FA Cup from step 6 and we weren't overly enthralled by the prospect of a long trip to London. Although very happy to be participating in the FA Cup again.

As I recall it was an uninviting venue which has been much improved now, as has our own Martello ground, but we returned home very happy with a 3-0 win under our belts and a good

proportion of the 73 spectators on our coach.

There is link between 2005 & 2024, he will be inside the pitch perimeter this afternoon and in the dugout during the game. No clues, Becky Wybrow you're excluded from guessing!

If you are reading this on Tuesday, you are probably scratching your head & wondering what the devil is he on about, sorry we had Haringey Borough here on Saturday in the FA Trophy.

I'm expecting the current league leaders to be tonight's opposition, they hosted Gorleston on Saturday and started the day top of the table so I think the Greens will have had a difficult afternoon.

There has been steady progress at The Hive over the last four seasons or rather post covid, finishing 19th, 17th. 14th and last season 9th, now they look genuine contenders for the title, so our home record could be fully tested tonight.

THE OTHER SIDE HARINGEY BOROUGH

It was not until 1970 that a team competed under the name of Haringey Borough when WOOD GREEN TOWN who had played at Coles Park since 1930 changed their name to Haringey Borough. A merger with EDMONTON FC in 1973 resulted in a brief change of name to Edmonton & Haringey FC until 1976 when the present name was re-adopted. The merged Club played in the Athenian League until it ceased to operate at the end of the 1983/84 season and then played for 4 seasons in Division 2 North of the Isthmian League. After a period of instability culminating in a year in the wilderness away from Senior football in 1988/89 they were admitted to the Spartan League in 1989/90 retaining Premier Division membership throughout until the South Midlands League merger in season 1997/98 when they finished 7th. in the Premier Division South to secure membership of the new "combined" Premier Division for 1998/99 as well as being runners up in the League's Premier Division Cup. In 2004 after an unsuccessful attempt to move the Club to the nearby New River Sports stadium and a walk out of the existing Committee Aki Achillea who had commenced his association with the Club in 1995 was appointed to lead the Club forward and together with George Kilikita and Secretary John Bacon the club sought to engage more with the local community and tap into the talent locally.

The senior men's team having been relegated to Division One of the Spartan South Midlands League in 2006/7 bounced back with promotion at the very first attempt and a fine season ended with both promotion and the winning of the Division One Cup. Back in the Premier Division for the season 2008/09 the Club again quickly found itself among the relegation strugglers leading to the appointment of the current

Manager the vastly experienced Tom Loizou. Tom and his excellent loyal team of coaching staff have been instrumental in turning around the Club's fortunes in the intervening years. In 2011/12 a highest ever 5th place was achieved and the League Challenge Trophy won. After massive stadium improvements in the close season with the erection of a new Clubhouse and new dressing rooms hopes were high for 2012/13 but the poor weather and the problematic pitch led to a massive fixture backlog which negated any chance of a serious challenge for honours and the Club finished 9th. In 2013/14 the Club's challenge for promotion took place in the Essex Senior League following a sideways switch imposed by the FA. The Club had what was then its most successful season ever finishing runners up by just a solitary point to Great Wakering Rovers and ended the season with 20 wins and one draw from the final 21 League games. The League title was nevertheless secured at the second attempt in 2014/15 with a haul of 103 points from 38 games and with it promotion to Step 4 in which we were allocated to the Ryman League Division One North. The first season at the higher level was a baptism of fire when only 7 points were garnered from the first 17 games but by the close of the season a further 43 points had been amassed from the remaining 29 games and the Club finished in a comfortable 15th place. The first season in the FA Trophy produced two fine victories before a replay loss to Hitchin Town of the Evostik South Premier Division. The summer of 2016 saw yet further investment in the close season in the form of a 3G synthetic main pitch and added improvements to the perimeter, the spectator rails and the floodlights and has created a facility of which the Club can be proud; and has afforded a greater opportunity for the Club to move forward in all aspects. The first team in 2016/17 improved markedly on the previous season and had an excellent all round campaign although rather unfortunate not to finish the season on a high having ended with the "double heartbreak" of missing out on promotion through a 4-5 closely fought semi final play-off defeat at Maldon &

Tiptree FC after finishing 5th in the Division and an odd goal 2-3 London Senior Cup semi-final loss at Metropolitan Police. But 2017/18 was to be the Club's best ever and culminated in promotion to Step 3 via the play-off route with a 3-1 win over Canvey Island after automatic promotion had been missed by just two points. And in FA Competitions the 4th and final round of the Qualifying rounds for the FA Cup was reached, although that ended in disappointment with a 2-4 home defeat by Heybridge Swifts who then enjoyed a visit to Exeter City in the First Round Proper. In the FA Trophy we went right through the qualifying campaign and were lucky enough to draw Leyton Orient in the First Round Proper which brought a record attendance of 1,133 to Coles Park and "The O's" left mightily relieved at having come back to win 2-1 after going a goal down in the fifth minute. 2018/19 was another great but ultimately disappointing season with an FA Cup run which took us into the First Round Proper where it was ended rather cruelly by AFC Wimbledon's last minute goal at Coles Park in front of a record crowd of 2,710. Having led the Premier Division for several weeks in mid-season it was somewhat surprising that we dropped from 2nd to 3rd on the last day of the season after a poor late run but still enjoyed home advantage in the Play-Off Semi-final in which a 45 minute second half onslaught on the Tonbridge Angels goal produced only one goal in response to the two they had scored before the interval. The 2019/20 season's early termination was less of a disappointment for us than for many other Isthmian Premier Division Clubs as we were marooned in mid-table with no realistic prospect of entering either the promotion or relegation zones. The highlight of the season should have been the visit of National League Yeovil Town in the Final Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup but, as is well known, appalling crowd behaviour brought that game to an early end and the second game seemed something of an anti-climax. In fact, without making excuses, that unpleasant episode seems to have adversely affected our players for some time for, whereas we had been well in the promotion places mix,

thereafter we just drifted downwards. The early termination of League Fixtures for 2020/21 was more of a blow than was the previous seasons voiding as we were well placed to make a charge towards a play-off place at least. However the Buildbase FA Trophy continued and we enjoyed a run through to the 4th Round Proper when Oxford City of the National League South finally eliminated us 4-2 after we had been two up; en route we had overcome Faversham Town, Bishops Stortford, Eastbourne Borough and Dartford, the last two also being National League South Clubs. The London Senior Cup also carried on and due to withdrawals, we reached the quarter-final without playing a game but lost a penalty shoot out to Hanwell Town after a 2-2 draw. The 2021/22 season was more or less a non-event as regards any real challenge for the League top spots but the semi-finals of The League Cup and the London Senior Cup were reached with both games ending in odd goal defeats in the space of a week. We may well have set a Club record for the highest number of injuries sustained in any season and that even led to an outside chance of relegation towards the end of the season but the failings of others meant we were never in serious danger.

2022/23 was a disappointment in League terms as we lost our way quite early after a start which gave rise to play-off hopes and 15th place was the final outcome. But we did reach the London Senior Cup final where we faced Charlton Athletic Under 23s at Hendon's Silver Jubilee Park. Three down after half an hour we looked dead and buried but fought back ferociously to level with three goals all from set pieces (2 direct free kicks and a penalty) finally going down to a 3-5 defeat after extra time. Season 2023/24 will live long in the memory but for all the wrong reasons. A disastrous start which saw only one point in the bag after nine League games meant there was a mountain to be climbed if the four relegation spots were to be avoided. As the season wore on it seemed that there was just a possibility that we might claw our way to safety but garnering only three points from the final nine League games put paid to any lingering

optimism. So we now return to the North Division after six seasons in the Premier Division in which we had come within a whisker of promotion to the National League. Early exits from three of the four Cups entered meant that reaching the semi-final of the other - the League Cup - provided some cheer to an otherwise dismal season. The Under 23s having switched to the Essex Alliance following the winding up of the Isthmian League Development section reached the semi-final of their League Cup where they encountered the runaway League Champions. The Womens Team went one better and provided the highlight of the Clubs season by reaching the Final of the Capital Womens Senior Cup and gave National League Ashford Town a serious challenge before losing 4-2.

2016/17 saw the introduction of a much needed "second" team, formed to compete in the Ryman Development League it being basically intended for Under 21 players but with the facility to include up to 4 older players in every squad. The team held their own comfortably in the League finishing a very creditable 6th place and the benefits of the Club's participation were all too evident with the introduction of a number of players into the first team squad throughout the season and the opportunity for first team squad players to keep fresh and those who were returning from injury had a platform to get fit. Thereby proving the benefits of having such a side. The age restriction was amended to Under 23 for 2017/18 and the team which had always been near the top of the table, continued to do well in the following seasons and won the North Division Championship in 2021/22 but lost to South Division Champions Hastings United in the "Champion of Champions" play off. 2022/23 saw the North Division reduced to just 6 teams playing each other 3 times following withdrawals and the League decided not to run an Under 23 (Development) Section at all.

Youth teams were commenced and run successfully for many years at various age levels with some considerable success particularly at the older age groups including progress into the 2nd round proper of the FA Youth Cup in

2006/07. They were Divisional winners of the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League in 2004/05 and 2009/10 They were winners of the League's Colwyn Cup in 2004/05 and runners up in 2008/09. After a few seasons absence from Youth football the Under 18s rejoined the Southern Counties competition in 2017/18, winning its Divisional Championship at the first attempt and finishing towards the top of the table in the following seasons until falling away somewhat and finishing mid-table in 2022/23 and 2023/24. This will again provide a pathway for talented local boys to make their way into the first team squad and ultimately the first team itself.

The Women's Team was formed in 1999 and competed in the Eastern Region Womens League winning promotion in its first season and then to its Premier Division for 2002/03; and there they have remained save for two seasons, the first being in 2011/12 following relegation to Division 1 from which they made an immediate Premier Division return as runners-up. Steady improvement began and we were extremely fortunate to have been approached midway through the 2014/15 season by renowned coach and former professional footballer Steve Browne who at the time was involved in the highly successful S & T Academy Girls football. Steve was duly appointed Manager and preserved the Women's Premier Division status. In 2015/16 a mid table position was easily secured from an uneven campaign which included convincing away wins at the top 2 Clubs and some surprisingly disappointing performances against lower placed teams. In 2017/18, by Christmas the team were runaway League leaders only to be thrown off course by the tragic early death of Steve on New Years Day but after a shaky period the Women re-asserted themselves to win the League Championship with their last League game of the Season and with it, promotion to the Women's Premier League and followed that up by adding the League Cup with a 5-1 win over Cambridge City to complete the double which was a fitting, lasting legacy for their Manager. The loss of many of the

successful squad, several to American University Scholarships, proved too much of a handicap at the higher level and relegation back to the Eastern Regional League was an unsurprising outcome.

Now under the stewardship of Bobby Cato significant steps forward seem certain and promotion is again a realistic prospect. An exceptionally young and talented squad was unlucky to find itself in danger of relegation towards the end of the 2021/22 season due to a high number of odd goal defeats but pulled clear with 4 vital points from the last two games. They look capable of going places if they stick together when experience is added to their armoury. The tie up with the Haringey Girl's Academy run by Adem Ali has proved massively successful and for the first time we are in a situation where talented young teenagers are ready and eager to compete for a place in the Women's squad as soon as they turn 16, although being a team substantially composed of schoolgirls in an adult League is not without its problems, but that did not stop them reaching the Final of The Capital Womens Senior Cup in 2023/24.

The foundations are in place for us to make a swift return to the Premier Division after major strengthening of the Men's Senior side and an exciting season is in prospect in which a challenge for at least a Play-off position is a realistic target as we renew our determination to eventually achieve National League status. The facilities and structures are also in place for the Club's other teams to improve and enhance on recent successes.

PEN PICS

MICHAEL ACQUAH – A goalkeeper who has played for Huddersfield Town's U19s and B Team, Farsley Celtic on loan and Norwich U21s.

WILLIAM ADEMILUYI – A forward, William was with Burton Albion's U18s last season.

EBENEZER ADDO KUFOR – Ebenezer played over 30 games for us last season mainly occupying

the right back position he is versatile and was asked to perform other roles across the defence.

GEORGIOS ARESTI – A huge favourite with everyone at Haringey, Georgios has been with the club since 2018. A player that drives the team forward and always gives 100% although this means he plays on the edge given his desire to tackle and win the ball back. His career has seen him play for AEK Athens and numerous teams in Cyprus, he has also won international caps for Cyprus.

DEREK ASAMOAH – Derek returns to the Boro following a previous spell during season 2017-2018. His career has seen him play over 300 league appearances, scoring 45 goals for Northampton Town, Mansfield Town, Lincoln City, Chester City, Shrewsbury Town and Carlisle United. His football journey has also seen him play in France, Scotland, Bulgaria, and South Korea. He also has 4 Ghana caps and one international goal. Since leaving the Boro he has appeared for Cheshunt, Brightlingsea Regent and became the all-time top goal scorer for New Salamis.

AKILJO BALLIU – A winger, Akiljo joins from Clapton, he has also played for Great Wavering Rovers, AC Milano's and Redbridge Community.

BOBSON BAWLING – Bobson has had two spells with the Boro, a winger who previously played over 70 games in the football league for Crawley Town, scoring 6 goals. Other clubs Bobson has played for include Woking, Torquay United, Oxford City, St Albans City, Enfield Town, and Hendon. Known for his versatility, Bobson can play in various midfield positions and has also been deployed as a right-back.

TOMMY BOXER – An experienced centre back, Tommy was player-manger at New Salamis during the 2023/2024 season.

DAN CAREY-EVANS – Dan was on loan at the Boro from Cambridge United last season but has now registered to play this season, a centre half, he joined the Cambridge United Academy

at the age of 13 after spending a significant part of his childhood in Spain.

CALEB DENNIS – A young full back who has signed from the U23s, Caleb has previously played for the West Ham Foundation and Shepherd's Bush.

JORGE DJASSI SAMBU – A huge influence on the team's success in recent years, Jorge is a centre midfielder that loves to tackle and is a commanding figure in the centre of the pitch. He has now been with the club for over 10 seasons but will always be held in the highest regard for his 2 goals in the play-off semi-final of 2018.

RICHARD ENNIN – A winger who has played for Enfield Borough and Leverstock Green, last season he made over 30 appearances for Ware.

OLIWIER FUSIEK – Centre back Oliwier impressed when stepping up from the Under 23s last season to finish the season as a first team player.

ENRIQUE KALSÍ – A young goalkeeper who will be looking to break into the team this season.

LOUIS MAFFIA – Louis is a centre midfield player who signed from West Essex, he impressed in trial games pre-season which earned him a place in the squad.

STEPHANE MGBADA – Stephane was a regular last season for the Under 23s, his performances earned him a call up to the first team where he made a good contribution in the games he played, scoring one goal at Potters Bar. An exciting forward, it is hoped Stephane continues his development and secures a regular first team spot.

SCOTT MITCHELL – Scott is a centre back who has been with the Boro since 2017, a huge favourite with the fans he has amassed over 200 appearances and won the supporters player of the year twice. A player who brings experience and brings a love of playing for Haringey, which is why everyone appreciates him.

ALEXANDER NICOLAIDES – The top scorer last season for the Under 23s, Alex played 10 times for the first team. A very skilful forward and only 17 years old, much is hoped that Alex can make the successful transition to first team football.

DIMITRI NICOLAOU – A dual registration signing with Chelmsford City, Dimitri plays in midfield and is always looking to get on the ball to start an attack.

UKO OJI – A young forward who joins on loan from Leyton Orient

TOSIN OLUFEMI – Tosin returns after two seasons at Bishop's Stortford where he won the Isthmian Premier League. Tosin was Haringey's captain when we won the play off in 2018 and his return is a real coup for the club. In his previous spells he played over 150 times and was top goal scorer in 2021/2022 despite being a right back.

ALAA OUJDI – A left back who likes to get forward, Alaa spent a several seasons at Ware making over 100 appearances before joining New Salamis where he was last season, 2023/2024.

RAKIM RICHARDS – It would be easy to write a full page on the impact and influence Rakim has had on Haringey Borough, since our foundation as Haringey Borough no one has made more appearances than Rakim. Known as Raks, his first appearance was in the season 2010/2011 and has been a part of both the Essex Senior League winning team and the Isthmian North play off winning team. Club captain, Raks is currently recovering from injury and given his importance to the team, his injury played a key factor in the team suffering relegation last season.

SEAN SANKANU – Sean a centre back joins from AFC Wimbledon's academy, he also played for Corinthian Casuals on loan last season and has played a couple of times for the U23s this season.

J'ARDELL STIRLING – Despite the struggles last season Boro fans were pleased to see centre back J'Ardell re-sign for 2024-2025. Previous

clubs include Walthamstow, Wingate & Finchley and Dunstable Town.

RUBEN TAVARES BAPTISTA – Ruben has progressed through both the Under 18 and Under 23 teams into the first team, demonstrating proof if you are good enough there is structure in place to develop at Haringey. Ruben is comfortable operating in any position down the right and has shown a determination to succeed since establishing himself in the first team squad.

JOE WAIGHT – A forward, Joe joins from Bowers & Pitsea, having also played for Averley during the 2024/2025 season. Last season Joe was top goal scorer for New Salamis. Previous clubs include Reading City and Wembley.

EMMANUEL YEBOAH – A forward who spent the 2023/2024 season at Wingate & Finchley.

MATT YOUNG – A favourite with the fans Matt returns to the Boro from Folkestone Invicta having left us in the summer. A classy midfielder who scored 15 goals last season. Previously Matt was twice loaned to us by Leyton Orient in 2022/2023.

THE OTHER SIDE BASILDON UNITED

Nicknamed 'The Bees', Basildon United came into being in 1967, having previously been known as Armada Sports; a junior club who were formed four years earlier.

In 1967/68 the renamed club joined the Grays and Thurrock League, moving into the Greater London League the following season.

The first major step forward came in 1970 when the Essex County FA granted the club senior status and it became a founder member of the Essex Senior League.

It was not long before The Bees got amongst the honours recording four consecutive championships from 1977 until 1980, which stands as a league record to this day.

In addition, Basildon finished runners-up in 1973 and 1975, whilst the League Cup was won in 1978 to complete that season's double. The following season the club were winners of the Essex Senior Trophy.

The Bees successfully applied for promotion to the Athenian League in 1980, but membership only lasted one season, as they finished runners up to Windsor and Eton and earned promotion to the Isthmian League Division 2. In this season, Basildon also progressed to the quarter finals of the FA Vase, before Irtlingborough Diamonds brought an end to progress in the competition with a 6-4 victory in a sixth-round replay.

After three seasons in the Isthmian League Division 2, Basildon achieved promotion as champions in 1984, pipping St Albans City by one point on the last day of the season. This season additionally saw the club reach the finals of both the Essex Senior Trophy and the Eastern Floodlight Competition.

Basildon found life a lot harder in the first division and eventually lost the struggle against relegation in 1989, dropping into the Isthmian



League Division 2 North. This was the first time that the club had suffered relegation in their history.

Two further seasons were spent in Division 2 North before the decision to de-regionalise the division led to the club resigning from the league, the club considering that an excess of travelling in the Isthmian League was not viable at that point.

The Bees re-joined the Essex Senior League in 1991/92 and quickly regrouped both on and off the pitch. It was not long before the successes of the late seventies were emulated, as The Bees finished in the top six in both 1991/92 and 1992/93 and made a League Cup final appearance in 1992.

A superb 1993/94 season saw Basildon again win the Essex Senior League double, with the championship being won for a record fifth time. The following season, 1994/95, the club battled through to the FA Vase quarter final for the second time in its history, before losing out to Raunds Town.

During 1997/98, The Bees equalled Brentwood's record of three Essex Senior League Cup wins by beating Burnham Ramblers 1-0 in the final. It was the club's sixth appearance in the final of this competition, which also remains a record. In the league, Basildon finished runners up to Concord Rangers.

1999/2000 saw Basildon finish 13th, which was the club's worst league finish at the time and although a reasonable 8th position was achieved in 2000/01, two bottom half finishes followed for the next two seasons. The club finished 7th in both 2003/04 and 2004/05.

John Higley was The Bees manager at the start of the 2007/08 season, but he was replaced by Jason Emery in October. The club struggled for form all season and used 72 players, only to finish in 16th position, just one place off the bottom.

A new management team of Colin Cook and Gary Morris was announced for the 2008/09 season and the club won its first six matches, whilst reaching the second-round proper of the FA Vase. However, by December the management



team had left the club and ex reserve coach, Jody Prewwell, was appointed manager, with Basildon eventually finishing the season in 8th place.

Prewwell left the club by mutual consent in April 2010 and was replaced by Sean Merchant as caretaker manager. The Bees suffered the heaviest defeat to date on 24 April, losing 10-0 at Witham Town. The club eventually finished the season in 12th place.

In May 2010, John Doyle returned to the club as manager, bringing in former Romford boss, Mark Reed as his assistant and Paul Rogan as coach.

After a 12th place finish, John Doyle decided to step down at the end of the 2010/11 season. The club advertised for a new manager and in excess of 30 hopefuls applied, with Paul Larke being appointed manager in June 2011.

After a poor start to the season, Larke resigned following a 9-1 defeat at Witham Town, with John Doyle returning to oversee the forthcoming FA Vase match against Ampthill Town.

The following week, Chris Wood was appointed permanent manager, but unfortunately no improvement was seen in results and The Bees finished bottom of the Essex Senior League for the first time in the club's history.

Former Ramsden boss, Bobby Barnes, was appointed manager in May 2012 and at just 27 was one of the youngest managers in non-league football. After Barnes decided to resign due to work commitments, John Higley returned to the club and was assisted by Steve Brown senior.

After a number of managerial changes, the club ended the 2012/13 season with Bertie Brayley as player/manager and the club finished the season in 13th position. Laurie Carter was appointed manager for the 2013/14 season and the club finished in 8th position.

In May 2014 Colin Cook returned to the club for a second spell as manager and he was assisted by Craig Gillam. Cook left during September being replaced by his assistant, who guided The Bees to a creditable 12th place finish.

Ahead of the 2015/16 season, Lee Connor was appointed as assistant to Gillam and the club enjoyed its best season for many years winning



the League Challenge Cup and finishing runners up in the league. Additionally, Brad Warner won the league's Golden Boot award.

With Gillam opting not to remain with the club for the 2016/17 season, the club appointed Aaron Bloxham as manager, who had previously enjoyed success with White Ensign in the Essex Olympian League. A mid-table finish was achieved in the league as well as notable success in the Essex Senior Cup where the club reached the last eight before bowing out against Heybridge Swifts in the quarter finals.

In May 2017 the club parted ways with Bloxham and Marc Harrison joined the club as manager, with Liam Wallace also joining as his assistant. Harrison and Wallace both joined the club from neighbours Basildon Town, where they had achieved considerable success winning Essex Olympian League Division One the

previous season.

In their first season in charge, Harrison and Wallace enjoyed tremendous success leading the club to the runners-up spot in the league and with it promotion back to the Isthmian League for the first time in 27 years.

Following a club reorganisation, Harrison and Wallace left the club in November 2018 and after a brief spell as Joint Manager with former Barkingside manager, Michael Walther, Lee Connor took temporary charge of team affairs. Subsequently, former Enfield 1893 and Laindon Orient manager, Neil Blackburn, took on the role as first team manager.

Blackburn stepped down as manager before the end of the 2018/19 season to be replaced by John Sussex who re-joined the club from Witham Town, having previously been a coach at the club. Sussex departed the club in November 2019 and after two short term caretaker appointments, Burnham Ramblers manager

Alex Salmon was brought into the role with a view to building a new side focussed on much needed stability.

However, Salmon's tenure was to be short lived as he resigned after the first game of the 2020/21 season and former Bowers & Pitsea U23 manager John Guyton was appointed to the position to continue the work that had begun under his predecessor.

After a run of below par results, Guyton left the club in November 2021 and Jon Fowell was appointed as his successor. Due to personal reasons, Fowell left his position in January 2022 and local lad Marc Benterman was appointed in his place.

With Benterman moving on in October 2022, former Hullbridge Sports duo Darren Manning and James Wakeling were appointed to the lead the side, with Manning subsequently taking sole charge following Wakeling's departure, to continue the club's exciting journey.

Tanju Colak was arguably, for a period in the late 1980s and early 1990s, the most fearsome striker in Europe. The Turkish frontman was a star for Galatasaray and then, controversially, Fenerbahce, proving unstoppable in his home country and deadly on the European stage. But instead of cementing his status as a legend, Tanju had dark secrets, often insisting on bringing a gun to training for his own protection from the mafia. When he should have been enjoying a glorious swansong and moving into retirement, he was caught engaging with the criminals he was so aware of, and consequently sent to prison. It was a dark ending against the brightest of careers.

Tanju was born in Samsun, joining his local Super Lig side at the age of 19 and making an instant impact, even as the team struggled. In his first season, he scored 16 goals, but saw his

team suffer relegation. He failed at the first attempts, despite his goals, but secured promotion the following season.

Samsunspor were the following season's surprise team, upsetting the natural order and the bookmakers to compete for the league title. Tanju finished as the league's top scorer as his side finished third, and then added another 25 goals in 1986/87 for good measure. The giants of Turkish football had seen enough, and didn't enjoy the league's best forward playing for some upstarts from the east. At the end of that season, Tanju moved to Galatasaray.

He scored a spectacular bicycle kick in his second game - one of two strikes - on his way to a record 39 goals in his first season. Nicknamed 'The King', his record remains unbeaten. More than a goal per game, once again, saw him win the European Golden Shoe, and Tanju and Galatasaray won the league with a comfortable 12-point margin. Unbeknownst to anyone, that would be his only major honour.

The following two seasons were disappointing domestically, although Tanju continued to score at a rapid rate. And in 1989, Gala went further than any Turkish team before or since in the European Cup, reaching the semi-finals where they were defeated by Steaua Bucharest, who were surprising everyone. Tanju once again played his part, scoring freely against European competition. At home, the following season, he once more scored more goals than games,

driving Gala back up to second, but falling short of Gordon Milne's great Besiktas side.

At the end of that season, in a bid to cut costs, Galatasaray sought to reduce the wages of some of their highest earners, Tanju among them. He was settled in Istanbul, and had been made captain of a side where he was loved, but the forward was unwilling to have his wages cut to the levels of what he deemed to be inferior players. He pleaded with the board to reconsider, and with his manager to exert some influence, but there was nothing they could do. A big offer was made by Marseille, which Tanju considered, but not wanting to leave Turkey, he took another, far more controversial decision. Fenerbahce, Galatasaray's great rivals, had heard of the contract dispute, and took the opportunity to pounce. Tanju moved from the European to the Asian side of the city, maintaining his wages, but threatening his legendary status.

At Fener, Tanju continued to score goals, and continued to just miss out on titles. But his private life was starting to become a cause for concern. Rumours surfaced in the press that the forward, who was married, was having an affair with Turkish actress Hulya Avsar, with details of his treachery splashed across the newspapers. That scandal did little to stop his goalscoring form, but the next one certainly did.

In December 1992, Tanju was arrested on suspicion of knowingly receiving a stolen Mercedes, and selling it on. Fenerbahce went to bat for their star man, with Club President Aziz Yildirim even going as far as calling the authorities corrupt. It made no difference, and Tanju was found guilty, sentenced to nine years in prison. He fled to Macedonia, but was quickly rearrested, and incarcerated.

The sentence was reduced on appeal, and then reduced again for his cooperation and good behaviour, but it was the end of his playing career. He was the Super Lig's highest ever goalscorer, a record that stood until Hakan Sukur went ahead of him, and fourth on Galatasaray's scoring list, despite only spending four seasons at the club.

His status at that club was trashed by his move across the city more than his arrest, but how was he seen at Fenerbahce? After his release, and retirement, the club arranged a testimonial for him, in which he made his final appearance on a football pitch. He donated the proceeds to a disaster relief fund, and returned to Samsun for a life of failed politics and repeated problems with the law.

A great goalscoring career, ended by criminality. But, for Fenerbahce at least, Tanju Colak remains a legend.

Enjoy the game.

In the southern section of the draw we're waiting to see whether Bishops Cleeve can add Chesham United to their scalps in the rearranged replay on Tuesday with Yeovil Town awaiting the winners.

Suffolk side Leiston beat Hornchurch in extra time on Tuesday to set-up a home date with National League Dagenham & Redbridge, while Chertsey Town host Sutton United.

Horsham enjoyed a fairytale run last season, drawing 3-3 with Barnsley before losing the replay and then being reinstated after the Tykes were found to have played an ineligible player.

They welcome Step 4 Gorleston, who have just dumped out St Albans City. The last time they reached the first round was in the 1957-58 season! IF they get there, surely that's worth a piece in the papers...
