Known for his sharp reflexes and commanding presence in goal, Harry has become a fan favourite for his clutch performances and undeniable passion for the game.




Harry, how have you found settling into the team and the town of Felixstowe? Have the fans and the community made you feel welcome?

I have settled into Felixstowe so well. The whole club players, staff, community and fans have been amazing and I've loved every bit of it.

Coming from a professional background, how have you adapted to the challenges of non-league football?

Yes, I definitely have. It's a lot more physical and the pitches and weather play a massive part, but the club and Felixstowe make it so enjoyable to play for.





# You work alongside forward Sam Ford as a football/goalkeeper coach. How did that partnership come about?

Yes, as much as I couldn't wait to sign for the club, coaching with Sam and SF COACHING played a massive part in the move and I'm loving every minute of it. Sam spoke to me and asked if I would I be interested and I snapped at the offer straight away

We're partway through the season—what would you say has been the highlight for you so far? Are there any specific matches or moments that stand out as particularly memorable?

The Borehamwood game was a stand out moment for the club and for me but I couldn't say one game specifically because every game has been amazing for me. But I reckon the best was seeing Jack Ainsley score at Concord Rangers!

Team spirit is a key factor in a successful season. How would you describe the atmosphere in the dressing room this year? I would like to think I'm a big voice in the dressing room and I feel like this year it has been really good and I've adapted well to boys and the staff.





As one of the newer players, how have you contributed to building the camaraderie within the squad?

I would say so yes. Those who travel to away games would know about me getting on the mic and calling people out to do karaoke.

As we look to the rest of the season, what are your predictions for Felixstowe and Walton United? Where do you see the team finishing in the league?

The gaffer spoke to me before signing and both of us having the goal of getting this club higher and taking it as high as we can do. My aim is promotion and nothing less.

With the departures of Noel Aitkens and Zak Brown, two key players, do you think the dynamic of the team will change?

It's a massive loss losing such good players but like I've said the group is so good and we are so close that we need to stay strong and keep pushing with whoever we play.

Do you have any personal goals or milestones you're hoping to achieve before the end of the season?

My goal is promotion and to get Felixstowe out of this league.

You've quickly become a fan favourite, especially among the younger supporters. Why do you think the kids have taken such a liking to you?





I think they have because I'm a bubbly, fun, outgoing character and I love coaching them and even just having a chat with them. They are really important for the club and the community.

How does it feel to know that you're looked up to by so many young fans? Does it add any extra motivation or responsibility for you on and off the pitch? Yes definitely, they love watching us all play and to play well and win games is the least we can do. They are amazing on match days and

it gives us lads a real buzz.



Between coaching and playing, you have a lot of interaction with the younger generation. How important is it to you to inspire the next wave of footballers, and what's your message to them?

I think it's so important they are the next us, so to keep them interested and playing as much as possible is vital. My one thing for them is to keep smiling and enjoy playing football.

We know you're prone to a bit of ink, have you had any new tattoos since playing for the Seasiders?

No I haven't yet, but there is some in the pipeline so keep and eye out!



Finally, with Christmas around the corner, how do you plan to spend the festive season?

I will be with my family over Christmas but with the Seasiders on Boxing Day.

Alex returns to Felixstowe having spent many years coaching within the youth and reserve setups at the club. Alex heads up the Goalkeeping section of the club and works with the Youth section right through to the Seniors and is an important member of the First Team Management structure.

#### DOUG FRENCH - KIT MAN

Doug started his career in 1986 and played for East Anglian Customs, Walton United, Felixstowe United and Tattingstone, breaking his leg four times in the process. Whilst playing for Ipswich Wanderers vets, Doug finally hung up his boots. Having found his vocation in washing players dirty pants, Doug is excited for a new challenge with the Seasiders.





### **DEFENDERS**

#### **HARRY WRIGHT (GK)**

Harry started his career as a professional at Ipswich Town and left there in 2021 where he then went on to play for Fleetwood Town and Bury before joining the Seasiders in the summer of 2024. He has quickly become a firm fans favourite and works within the clubs Academy system.

#### **ZAC TUVEY (GK)**

Zac has impressed consistently with our U18's and despite his tender age of 16 is playing regularly both for our U18's and Haverhill Borough first team. Zac is Harry's understudy, is a fantastic shot stopper and has a bright future in the game.



#### HISTORY

Waltham Abbey Youth Club, based in Waltham Abbey, first played football at "Capershotts" during the Second World War and in later years the club became known as firstly Waltham Abbey, then Abbey Sports. Both clubs gained numerous honours in the Northern Suburban League.

The club was founded in 1944 with a mix of players from Waltham Abbey Youth Club and former juniors from Tottenham Hotspur under the leadership of the trainer and manager Wally Hickman. The secretary was Mo (Maurice) Ward. The President was Capt. Larkin.

In their early years they played to a high standard and reached the final of the Herts Junior Cup in three years out of four but lost on each occasion – including a loss to Redbourn Rovers of 4–5 after they had been leading 4–1.

Some of the leading players in the early years included left winger Dave Cook who was killed in a road crash, centre-half Robbo Robinson and inside forward Frank Blower. Frank later became a dedicated treasurer of the club with Ray Buck as a similarly dedicated club secretary.

Waltham Abbey United emerged in the late sixties and a new clubhouse was built. In 1974 the club amalgamated with the successful Beechfield Sports and joined the Metropolitan League, which later became the London Spartan League.

In 1976 the club won the Essex Junior Cup beating Maldon St Mary's 1–0 at Grays Athletics ground. Alfie Hall was the goalscorer. Later that summer the club dropped the Beechfield Sports tag on the advice of The FA. Two years later the club reached the final of the Essex Intermediate Cup (losing 1–2 to Dagenham Reserves at Epping Town FC) and won the league's Division One title, and, having gained Senior Status,

were promoted. In their first season they won the title without losing a game and were again promoted this time to the Premier Division where they remained until season 2000–01.

In 1990–91 the club were inaugural finalists in the Roy Bailey Memorial Trophy, a competition for local teams including Cheshunt, Ware, and Hertford Town

It was won for the first time in 1994–95 when they beat Hoddesdon Town. In both 1996–97 and 2005 (in the final held over from the previous season) they beat St Margaretsbury.

In 1998–99 they won the London Senior Cup with a fine 3–2 win over Bedfont at Dulwich Hamlet's ground, Dean Green securing a hat trick to win the cup. They also secured the Spartan South Midlands Challenge Trophy beating Holmer Green 3–0 over two legs.

Recent seasons have seen a lot of changes on and off the pitch with floodlights being installed in 1990 and the ground levelled. A great amount of work has been done around the clubhouse and a 200-seater stand built. A number of seats were purchased from Maine Road and these were installed during the summer of 2005 as the club strived to improve facilities on and off the field and move up the non-league pyramid.

Season 2001–02 was spent in the Essex & Herts Border Combination to allow them to move across the pyramid. They were elected to the Essex Senior League for season 2002–03. In 2004–05, in addition to winning both the League Cup and the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy they finished in their highest position of 2nd.

On 2 May 2009, the Abbott's capped off a successful 2008–09 season by beating Concord Rangers 5–4 on penalties, after a 1–1 draw, to win the Isthmian League Division 1 North Play-offs. They played in the Isthmian League Premier Division for the first time in their history in 2009–10. However, despite winning the last two games of their season, they finished 21st and were relegated for the first time in the club's history. After 7 seasons in North Division a league restructure saw the club have been moved into the newly formed Isthmian League South Central League.

# THE LOST IRISH SUPERSTAR

The Munich Air Disaster is a watershed moment in the history of English football. It saw the loss of a golden generation of talent, much of which had, or was expected to, make an impact on the national stage. Matt Busby's 'babes' had to be rebuild almost from scratch, taking almost a decade to win the European Cup he was so desperate for, with survivor Bobby Charlton at the heart of the new team. But alongside the seven English victims of the tragedy was a solitary non-English body. And Irish international Billy Whelan might just have become that nation's best ever player.

Whelan was born in 1935 in Dublin, and after losing his father aged only eight, he showed little serious interest in becoming a footballer. The priesthood called to him, and would have been a far more appropriate profession for him to take up in Ireland in the 1940s and 1950s. His brothers had an influence though, with eldest brother Christy playing for Transport, and middle brother John playing for Shamrock Rovers. As a teenager, Whelan joined Home Farm, but it wasn't long before he joined Matt Busby's revolution at Manchester United. When discovering that they had made him an offer, Christy remarked 'it's about bloody time'.

A quiet 18-year old, Whelan started his career in United's reserves, making his debut in the FA Youth Cup final, and embarking on a tour of Switzerland. His ability saw envious glances from clubs across Europe, and those in South America (where the lack of a wage cap was seeing something of a revolution) enquired about his availability. But Busby was also impressed with Whelan's deft touch and a physicality that belied his age. He fast tracked him into the first team, at a



time when that just didn't really happen. 'If you're good enough, you're old enough'.

An Inside Left, he made his senior United debut in 1955, performing well enough to keep his place amongst more senior professionals. In his second season, the would-be priest started to click with his new teammates - something fans in Manchester already thought had happened - and fired in a return of 33 goals in 56 appearances. At the age of just 20, the Irishman had the world at his feet, and the weight of his national on his shoulders. He was going to change footballing history.

Matt Busby was a man possessed. He had rebuilt Manchester United after the war in his own image, dispensing with old wisdom about old players and trusting in youth. They were physical enough when they needed to be, but mesmerising with the ball at their feet. He was convinced they could take on the best in the world, and had already conquered English football. But by the



start of the 1957-58 season, he had watched a Real Madrid side of Alfredo di Stefano, Ferenc Puskas and Raymond Kopa with the first two European Cups, and he wanted a piece of that action. Manchester United, he believed, should be competing with the European elite, not just beating the domestic elite.

That season, the draw saw United take on Shamrock Rovers, a special game for Whelan. He had won four caps for his nation, but still felt he didn't have the trust of national manager Johnny Carey, who would be in attendance. He had also received criticism at home for abandoning the League of Ireland, so this would be a chance to show them exactly why.

In cold and blustery conditions in Ireland,
Shamrock gave everything to compete with the
exciting young side Busby had put together,
but to no avail. Despite holding the English
champions for most of the first half, Tommy
Taylor broke the deadlock just before half time.
In the second half, the visitors ran riot, with
Whelan scoring two of the five additional goals
United added. It was a personal success for him,

but it was a high point. He was informed that his mother was unwell, and his form dipped. A young Bobby Charlton took his place in the starting XI.

There was no question of his ability at Old Trafford, and he was expected to be back to his best in no time. He asked to be excused from travel to Yugoslavia for the quarter-final because he wasn't expected to play, and wanted to visit home. But Busby wanted him to fly, to be available in case of an injury.

What happened on the night of 6th February 1958 requires no explanation. The icy runway, the loss of so much life, the memorial every February suffice. The headlines, in England at least, went to Duncan Edwards, the jewel at the heart of the Busby Babes, who fought for his life for two weeks before finally succumbing to his injuries. But Ireland lost a star that night too.

Never a confident flyer, as the plane started to attempt it's take off in Munich Whelan is said to have remarked 'this may be death, but I'm ready.' It was tragically prophetic.

Enjoy the game.

# PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH ROUND UP

It was a day of terrible weather and very few goals, but Felixstowe, Swifts and Redbridge came out on top

Bury Town had an enforced absence, so **Felixstowe and Walton United** had the chance to eat into their five point lead as they travelled to North London to face **Haringey Borough**. The Seasiders were ten matches unbeaten, but draws in three of their last five had slowed their challenge somewhat; whilst Borough, three points away from safety, were without a win in six - and indeed had only one win from their previous ten. The match was goalless until eighteen minutes from time, and the goal, when it arrived, went to the visitors - Josh Hitter making the breakthrough. That turned out to be that, the Seasiders now only two points behind the leaders after defeating these opponents for the second time this season.

Witham Town, a point behind Felixstowe in third place, were also in London, as they headed to Redbridge - a rather shorter trip. Witham are having a fine season, and had only two defeats from ten matches, whilst the Motormen were in tenth after a rather inconsistent campaign, but had won five of their eight home matches so we suspected would pose a tough challenge. The match looked as if it was ebbing to a goalless draw, but seven minutes from time the hosts made the breakthrough, Joseph Elliott with the goal. The Motormen held on to go ninth, whilst Witham remain third. Since Redbridge were promoted

the sides have met four times, and Witham are still without a win - the Motormen winning three.

**Heybridge Swifts** once again tried to banish their home hoodoo, as they welcomed Walthamstow. Swifts have been superb on the road but had won only once on their own patch. Stow were five unbeaten, and were looking for a third successive win - victory which, if it arrived, would take them to within a point of their hosts with two games in hand. The hosts hit the ground running, and were ahead after only nine minutes, Andrew Fennell's ninth of the season, before doubling their advantage fifteen minutes later, Scott Sloots taking his tally for the season to six. On sixty four minutes Walthamstow had a lifeline, Jared Small halving the deficit, but that was as good as it got for the visitors, Swifts up to seventh - a point away from the top five.

Bottom side **Ipswich Wanderers** hoped to begin to pick up points as they welcomed **Gorleston**, and they needed to, given that they were eight points away from safety at kick off. Wanderers had lost their previous six matches, and indeed had picked up one point from the previous thirty available, whilst the Greens had ended a three match losing run by defeating Grays in midweek. The match was goalless until eighteen minutes from time, and when that changed it was the visitors who went ahead, Lewis Johnson the scorer- but Wanderers didn't despair and were soon level, Jose De La Paz scoring the equaliser five minutes from time. The scoring stopped there.
